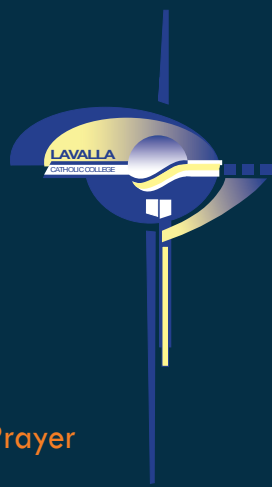

Yr 7 Refurbishment

The Maintenance team have done a wonderful job on the refurbishment of the eastern end of the Year 7 area. We have moved to more open style classrooms which facilitate twenty-first century learning. These spaces allow for greater collaboration as well as providing spaces for individual work and group instruction. They are certainly more inviting spaces than most adults would have experienced during their schooling. I encourage you to visit the centre when next you visit the campus, I am sure the Year 7's will be delighted to show off these great spaces.

Later in the year, when half the Year 9 students move to Presentation campus for MSP, we will re-locate the Year 7 students in to the western end of the building so that the four classrooms there can also be upgraded.

Art Building

The long awaited Art Building is underway. While all that is visible currently is the concrete slab, much work has been done on services throughout the holidays. We expect to have use of this building during term two.

There has also been programmed painting of the campus and as always, the paint has freshened up the buildings.

The grounds too have had a great deal of work done and are looking beautiful. It is important that our students are educated in attractive surroundings, this helps develop a sense of pride in themselves and their school and makes them more open to learning.

Carpets

There have been new carpets laid through the "old Kildare" building corridors and this has proved to be quite a face lift.

There have been major changes in the Canteen, and the manager, Mrs Anna Di Savia is keen to experiment with the menu choices, while providing healthy and nutritious food.

Holiday Works - Presentation Campus

Security has been put in place to safe guard the campus while it is not in daily use this term. Time has been spent over the holidays maintaining the gardens and clearing the fence line. Year 9 MSP classes will commence there in term 2.

Uniform

ICT

The ICT team were busy throughout the holidays upgrading the wireless system within the College. As with most projects of this nature there were some unforeseen problems and these have meant that the system was not functioning as we expected during the first days of school. The team have worked long hours to overcome these problems. It has been disappointing that students have not been able to reliably use technology to aid their learning. Work on obtaining this reliability is a number one priority for the team and the College.

Reminder:

With the launch of Project Compassion on Tuesday, 12th February, we ask that all students on the St Paul's Campus and Student Leaders come dressed in full summer uniform.

Bus issues

There has been overcrowding on the Moe/Newborough route and this has been of concern. In the short term the College has undertaken to provide an extra bus to support the Bus lines provided bus so that students will not be standing in the aisle. We will continue to work through this conveyancing issue and will continue to provide this service until a better solution can be found.

Project Compassion

With an early Easter this year, Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday are upon us and we will be hosting the Diocesan launch of Project Compassion at the St Paul's Campus next Tuesday. Bishop Christopher will join with student representatives from all primary and secondary schools within the Diocese to launch this year's appeal. As a Catholic school we strive to have students understand themselves as interdependent global citizens taking responsibility to make a difference in our world. Welcome to all of our parents and students at the beginning of an exciting new school year. We are thrilled that so much student centred work has been completed over the Christmas break in support of providing a 21st Century education for your children.

Of particular interest and focus, the first phase of our redesigned Year 7 learning space is up and running. This facility is designed to allow for a wide range of collaborative learning experiences to be presented for student engagement. A feature of this construct, other than the internal spaces and furniture, is the provision of external 'break out' spaces which our students will be invited to take ownership of and to nurture through plantings and design features such as artwork. Year 7 parents will be invited to meet their homeroom teachers and view the space during the Year level segment of the Parent Information Evening on Tuesday, Feb 12th.

In addition to our year 7 space, you will notice that St Paul's has been completely repainted externally in a coordinated colour scheme and student amenity has been improved in terms of seating and by the re-erection of several shelters close to the oval for shade and more comfortable eating opportunities. Our gardens and grounds are in fantastic shape also and are a credit to our maintenance staff.

if you have been past the College over recent weeks you would have noted that the new Arts building is also progressing well and with the foundation work completed the steel framework is evolving rapidly into the skeleton of a building. The next few weeks should see a roof structure take shape as we head toward a completion date and commissioning in Term Two.

In terms of events, please note the Caritas Launch and Parent Information Evening to be held at St Paul's on 12th February , our Swimming Carnival on the 25th February and the College Commissioning Mass on March the 5th.

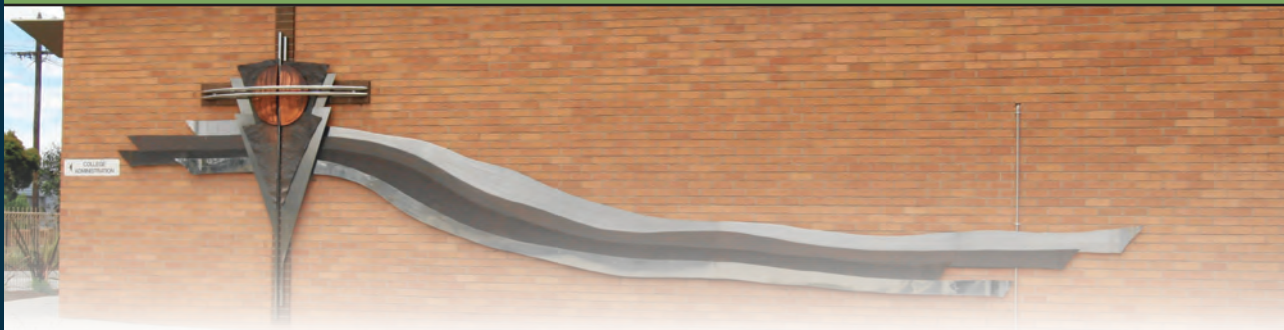

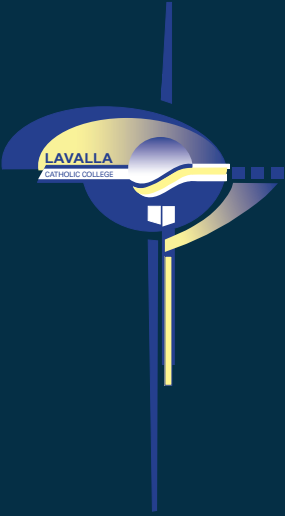

The previously advertised Second Hand Uniform Shop late session open days for 2013 have changed. An updated list of our open days can be obtained from Reception or the Student Services Centre. The Uniform Shop is open fortnightly on Thursdays except during school holidays. We run from 3.30pm to 6.00pm with some later sessions during the year for the changeover of uniform. We accept Cash, Cheque or EFTPOS.

The Uniform Shop is currently very well stocked on most clothing items but smaller sizes are limited. Guidelines and labels for selling your items are available on the website.

If you have never been to the Uniform Shop before we encourage you to come in and have a browse. Changing rooms are provided and we recommend bringing your child with you to try clothing on, this is especially necessary with Kilts and Blazers.
