Uniform Issues

I need to raise with you some clarifications about the Uniform. Staff members on all campuses are working hard at this. However it is a thankless task and one where we really appreciate the co-operation of parents and students.

There is reasonable compliance with the items required by the Uniform Regulations. Students at St Paul's Campus and Presentation Campus are using the College pullover/jumper as their outer garment. The sports uniform with the College rugby top is in evidence.

The Kilt is meant to be below the knees. The kilt has generally lasted well, depending on growth. We note however that there are some who are shortening the kilt and some who have taken it to a seamstress to shorten it. This is unacceptable.

Compliance with the wearing of the blazer on the Kildare is improving. There are still some notable exceptions and we would like to see an improvement there.

The outer garment in winter should be the Blazer or the College pullover. A shirt is not an acceptable outer garment in winter

Caps and beanies are not acceptable part of the uniform in winter.

It is disappointing to see so many shirts out. I have asked staff to be more vigilant in this thankless task of requiring shirts to be tucked inside the trousers or kilts. I appeal to those habitual offenders to do the right thing and present themselves a bit more neatly. I think that they are letting everyone down by adopting such a cavalier attitude about their presentation.

Year 11 Examination Period

During the week of June 15 - 18 all Year 11 students will be presenting for the Semester I Exams. There will also be a Year 11 English, and a Year 10 Mathematics Exam conducted today, Thursday, June 10. The Exams are compulsory and will be arranged around the usual daily timetable. Students who do not have an exam on a particular day will be required at school where classes will run as normal. Teachers will no doubt be spending much of the week in preparing their students for exams by revising, honing skills and delivering subtle hints and tips for the exams in their subject areas.

It is important that the examination period is taken very seriously. It is good practice for the Year 11 students to sit exams, as they will be faced with the prospect of exams when they reach Year 12 in just a few short months. Parents may be of great help to their daughters and sons, not only by showing interest in the Examination Timetable and wishing them luck on the day of an exam, but also in a very practical way, by ensuring that their daughters and sons have pens and spare pens, pencils,

erasers, rulers, that batteries are renewed in calculators if necessary, that a suitable study environment is created at home and they have plenty of sleep leading up to the examination period.

The best way to eliminate the stress and anxiety that can be created around exams is to be very well prepared. The wise student (and parent) does not underestimate the importance of preparation for the exams.

CAS Basketball Competition

Following on from the preliminary zone basketball competition, two College teams made it through to the Catholic All Schools (CAS) finals on Thursday May 27th in Bendigo. Each team competed against the winner of the other three Victorian zones with the top two teams playing off in the grand final.

The junior girls lost their first game to Bendigo (17 to 26) but beat their other two competitors (38 to 12 and 28 to 23) to set up a rematch in the grand final with the home team.
