Dear Parents and Students

It has been an important week of celebrations and we welcomed and appreciated the presence of Bishop Coffey, Br Paul Gilchrist, the Provincial of the Marist Brother, Br John McMahon, the Director of the Champagnat Education Council and Dr Therese D'Orsa, the Director of Catholic Education in the Diocese of Sale. Their presence made the Commissioning of our College Leaders a memorable occasion reminding us that we do not stand alone in this community but that we are participants together in building a strong and vibrant community.
