Dear Parents and Student

It was refreshing to return to the cool air of winter this week after having been in the heat and humidity of Rome. I mentioned to you earlier in the year that I am a member of the *Preparatory Commission for the Marist International Assembly*. This committee meets in Rome and is working on organising an International Conference for all those involved in Marist works. The Conference will be held in Brazil in September 2007.

Further, the Superior General of the Marist brothers was visiting our Province this week. The Leadership team from Lavalla Catholic College and Leadership teams from other Marist schools in Victoria were invited to meet with Br Sean Sammon and to enter into conversation with him about the changing needs of our young people and how best we might respond. It is a question that Br Sammon is asking of all the Provinces around the world and interestingly while the context might be quite different between regions the issues are quite similar.

In his address, he pinpointed the challenges for us today to be:

- Clarity of our mission
Are we clear about what we are called to do in this age and time?
- Honesty in that mission
Are we being honest in our work? Do the old structures still work?
- Co-responsibility for mission
Brothers and lay people taking equal responsibility for educating the young people in our care and for the social change that needs to spring from this work
- An appreciation for world-wide network.
How might an international perspective/network assist us in our daily work?

Not only did Br Sean Sammon's visit remind us of our world-wide connection to the Marist family but his inspirational address helped us reaffirm our commitment to our young people. He called us to form and transform our young people by helping them know and understand the love of God. He challenged us to face the future and to look to it for answers by being sensitive to the 'sign of the times' but also by having a solid understanding of our past and our traditions.

The Marist mission is entering an exciting time of renewal and renaissance ensuring that as a College we remain a vital and dynamic group of people who are inspired and spurred on by Marcellin's spirit and Charism.

GippsWebs for Business:

On Wednesday, August 2, Mr. Briggs, Mr. Swansborough and I attended the GippsWebs for Business presentation evening at Monash University. GippsWeb for Business is sponsored by Telstra CountryWide, The Baw Baw Latrobe Local Learning and Employment Network and the Monash University School of Information Technology. GippsWebs for Business allows students to spend time with small business owners and local entrepreneurs, gathering information and learning about the daily operation of their business. They then develop a web site that will help grow the business. The experience allows students to develop their skills in Information Technology, and by doing so is preparing them for further education and meaningful careers.

The program saw over twelve schools, one hundred and forty students in sixty-two teams and over fifty businesses take part. Each team was judged in their Shire area and the top three teams from Latrobe, Wellington and East Gippsland Shires were entered into the finalist section. The winners were judged by academics from the Gippsland School of Information Technology from this top nine on the following criteria: content (50%), presentation of the website (40%) and the students' written report showing evidence of planning (10%).

Mr. Swansborough entered **Andrew Northover** and **David Radovich** into the competition. Their project centred on a website for Caravanning Australia. Their presentation was very good and were awarded second place overall. Mr. Briggs' team comprised **Gianni Romano**, **Allan**

Renwick, **Kevin Munro**, **Nathan Gilchrist** and **Mitchell Hodge**. Their project provided a virtual tour of the Strzelecki Motor Lodge, which included a most creative and interactive home page. Their presentation was also very good and they were awarded third place. Congratulations to both teams and to their teachers.
