### **College Blazer:**

Some students still do not have a blazer, so I offer this clarification about the College blazer.

- 1. The College Blazer is compulsory for all students in Years 10, 11 and 12. If students wish to remove the Blazer after Homeroom, they may put their blazer in their locker during the day but are expected to put it back on again to go home.
- 2. Students are expected to wear the complete uniform to and from school and to wear the complete uniform to homeroom. This includes the blazer, unless students are entitled to wear the PE uniform, e.g. Thursdays and PE days.
- 3. The blazer is the normal school wear during the months of April to October. It is not required in the first and fourth terms. It is worn on all formal occasions, e.g. Opening Mass, Champagnat Day Mass, Photos, etc. and is also worn when students are representing the College e.g. some excursions or team sports events.
- 4. The Year 12 Rugby Top does not replace the blazer but takes place of the grey College jumper.

Students who do not have a blazer at this point are asked to be measured, to

place an order and to purchase it from Riggall's as soon as possible, please.

## **SAC Attendance:**

A reminder to all students studying VCE Unit 3: If a student fails to attend a scheduled SAC in any VCE Unit 3 study, they will be awarded a score of 0 and risk not satisfactorily completing the unit of study.

In order to complete any SAC outside of the scheduled class time, students need to successfully apply for **Special Provision**. This process involves a written application addressed to the VCE Co-ordinator as well as providing **supporting documentation**. Special Provision is designed to assist students who **become ill** or **experience personal hardship** at the time of assessment.

Students simply cannot arrange to be absent from a SAC for personal reasons.

## **Small Bore Rifle Competition:**

Gippsland Secondary Schools fought it out for the Howard and Schuback Perpetual Full Bore Trophy at the Rosedale Rifle Range on Friday last. Eight schools competed at the 500 yard (457 m) course.
