Our celebration of **World Environment Day** on June 5th commenced with the chance to preview the Year 9 Field Study projects.



This was followed by an assembly which included presentations by Ms Liz Radcliffe from the **Environment Protection Authority** and from Mr Dan Caffrey, Letitia McGown and Nicole **Xuereb** (Kildare Campus) to speak about Climate Change issues and the VISEN petition. Later, parents, staff and students worked together to improve the Campus surroundings. We planted

citrus trees in the orchard, tidied up some established trees and shrubs, planted an understory in some established areas, refreshed some garden beds, made the final preparations of our vegetable gardens and enjoyed a sausage sizzle in the sunshine.



Yet other students, on the day had the chance to gain greater knowledge of the environment through a series of guizzes or to develop their creativity through a card making activity. Much was achieved and the weekend's rain was a welcome blessing on our efforts!

Marist Charism

The month of June holds a special place in the Marist world. It was during the Brothers' morning prayers that Marcellin Champagnat, founder of the Marist Brothers, died at the Hermitage in France in 1840.

As a young priest, Marcellin gathered around him a small group of rustic youths who were touched by the plight of the rural poor after the long night that was the French Revolution. Formal education in the countryside was in tatters and the traditional methods of handing on the faith had been sorely tested by lack of priests and the dismantling of religious structures by the revolutionaries.

Into this void stepped Marcellin and grew his vision with those early brothers into a distinctive way of life for themselves as a community which overflowed into the schools they opened, first around Lavalla and L'Hermitage and then throughout rural France and beyond.

The Marists were given responsibility for evangelization in the Pacific region quite early in the nineteenth century and it was in the islands that St Peter Chanel became the first of many Marist martyrs. The Brothers came to Sydney in the 1880's and spread to all states opening schools for boys over the next hundred years.

Of recent times, as a staff, we have been examining the distinctive nature of the Marist charism and the style of our educational endeavour. Our style of educating is based on a vision that is holistic and that consciously seeks to communicate values. As a Marist school we share the vision of the early Marists that "to bring up children properly, we must love them, and love them all equally."

From this principle flow the particular characteristics of our style of educating: presence, simplicity, family spirit, love of work and following in the way of Mary. We seek to adopt these attitudes and values in our way of inculturating the Gospel. It is their sum and their interaction which gives our Marist style its Spirit inspired originality.

Champagnat Festival

In honour of Marcellin, we hold our annual Champagnat Mass during which we award the 'Champagnat Medals' to students and staff who imbue the Marist spirit and enflesh the school motto of "Strong Minds Compassionate Hearts". We wish to make this occasion a day of festival where students and staff celebrate who we are. We will begin with the Mass followed by music and a sausage sizzle and activities on each campus. Parents and families are most welcome to attend on the 28th July at 9.30am in the Champagnat Centre at the St Paul's campus.
