Dear Parents,

Over the last month, we have just had a number of functions and events. The Commissioning Mass, the various sporting events and the camps are all examples of where students need to co-operate, where they need to be able to follow directions and where they need to take responsibility. I am pleased to say that they have presented themselves and the College in an excellent light and showed what can be done. We are particularly pleased with the efforts of the student leaders and sports leaders and the various sporting teams.

As we settle down to the second part of the term, it is important to ensure that students attend to the various requirements arising out of their classes. Already I notice a number of senior students having to attend after-school sessions to complete work. When this happens so early in the year, it serves as a caution not to treat academic requirements in a cavalier fashion. I have been in schools long enough to know that there have to be sanctions for those who seek ways to avoid work and responsibility. Even senior students regress to early adolescent stages from time to time and they need to be reminded.

Hence, as a general "rule of thumb" students need to devote somewhat more effort and time to their work than they did previously. Each year should see them doing more work than in the previous year.

Remember also that in their early years of secondary, students forge the attitudes, values and preferences that will characterize their personalities throughout the senior years. So attending to work, making time for responsibilities and making up for any time missed are important element of self-discipline and character formation. Let's hope that teachers, parents and students can work together on this.
