The College will be raising money for the Leukaemia Foundation by participating in Shave for a Cure on Friday, March 21. All three Campuses will be involved. Participating students are asked to come to school with their hair temporarily coloured or to have their hair shaved. Each Campus will provide students with guidelines and direction as to how the day will be conducted.

VCAL – Vic. Certificate of Applied Learning

This year we have 40 students in years 11 and 12 who have chosen to do the Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning instead of the VCE. The program they do is arranged into four streams – Literacy and Numeracy, Work Related Skills, Industry Specific Skills and Personal Development. This certificate can be done at Foundation level – 10 students; Intermediate level – 15 students or senior level – 15 students.

As a part of the Industry Specific stream all of these students have taken up either a VET course or a Part-time School Based Apprenticeship. Both of these involve a work placement in an industry related to the studies they are completing. The Work Related skills stream involves the students developing the skills that will be needed for them to take their place in the workforce. Literacy and numeracy studies are done within the curriculum offered to all of the students at Lavalla. The Personal Development stream has been designed to build on the life skills of each student in a variety of ways. First -Aid training, participation in a Landcare project, Driver Education – preparation for L's or P's, as well as a Business Project where the students will be selling shares in a company they have established are all important aspects of the VCAL.

Each week of the VCAL program brings a new highlight. This week saw the Landcare group led by the valiant Mrs. Wilson drag a dead cow from the dam – a practical life skill if ever there was one.
