Reporting and Examinations in Semester 1, 2007

At this time last year there was quite some activity around the new compliance reports that provided parents with information regarding the assessment of their child's progress measured against the new VELS curricula. You will remember that the English and Mathematics reports were piloted using the progression points to indicate levels of achievement acquired at various stages. The extent of this new reporting method will be broadened this semester to include *Humanities*, *Health & Physical Education and Civics & Citizenship* with other subject areas to be phased in by 2008. Teachers are currently working on ensuring that learning activities and assessment tasks reflect students' performance according to the VELS standards.

The College is also introducing a *Pastoral Report* for all year levels, across the campuses this semester. This report will be written by Homeroom teachers to provide you feedback on how your daughters and sons develop meaningful relationships and engage in collaborative pursuits that contribute to community building, while strengthening their own personal, spiritual, social and academic growth.

By the time you receive this, Year 12 students will have sat their General Achievement Test (GAT). The Campus Director, Mr DiCesare and a team of interested staff have offered the Year 12s valuable workshops highlighting the need to take this exam seriously and the importance of each student trying her/his very best to ensure the best possible score. In the past, some students have perhaps taken this examination without these considerations and risked their end result. Through these workshops, hopefully students were well motivated to give it their best effort on the day.

We have also entered into the examination and assessment weeks for most year levels and your children should be quite busy completing work for assessment. If this is not the case it might be worth checking that your child is on track with your child's homeroom teacher.

Student Achievements: Tim Northe

The College is proud to let it be known that Tim Northe has been selected to represent Victoria in the Victorian Secondary Schools' Sports Australian Rules Football Country Team. This team will compete in the annual School Sport Australia Championship, which will be held in Sydney from 21 July.
