Attendance

This year, and especially during the last half of this term, the Campus Administration Team has been spending quite a deal of energy and time on following up students' attendance patterns. The monitoring of attendance is an obligation placed on us by the State Government, and the Registered Schools' Board conducts cyclical audits.

I would like to remind parents and students that the expectation of the College is that all students attend all classes. Students who are absent need to bring along a note upon their return to the College. Only then can the computer attendance system flag the absence as "Explained," and all other entries will remain "Unexplained" until such time as a note or other documentation is provided from home.

Already this semester there are a number of students who will not satisfactorily complete some of their subjects due to a substantive breach of the College attendance regulations.

Parents who take their children away on holidays during term need to be aware that such absenteeism impacts on their attendance, as well as the classroom continuity so important for sequential nature of activities in the classroom.

Year 12 students who are absent during a SAC need to successfully apply for **Special Provision**. This process involves a written application addressed to the VCE Coordinator as well as providing **supporting documentation**. Special Provision is designed to assist students who **become ill** or **experience personal hardship** at the time of assessment.
