Dear parents and students

A hearty welcome back to Term 4 and hopefully both students and teachers have had a restful break. Term 3 ended with two magnificent Debutante Balls and our congratulations are extended to all those who were presented.

At the senior end of the College, this is quite an unusual term in many respects. Our Year 12 students are focusing on their final exams and finishing their formal schooling. Our Year 11s are positioning themselves for their senior roles. By mid November the Year 10s will be the only students on the Kildare campus and we have over the years sensed in them an excitement about entering the senior years. This time can be unsettling for students as the warmer weather invites a festive air and students sense that the routine is different and the end of the year is close.

We ask for parental support to make certain that students come to school in correct uniform **EVERY DAY** and that homework and attendance is checked and monitored. It is important that they remain focused and that we take a gauge on behaviour and attitude to ensure that all finishes well.

Abortion Law Reform Bill

In recent months and weeks the Catholic conscience has been called upon to defend the life of the unborn child. Being a Catholic compels us not only to sit quietly with our values but to speak up and be heard, especially on the issue of Abortion. The **Abortion Law Reform Bill** is currently before Parliament and if passed will allow abortions to be performed up to 24 weeks after conception. Premature babies born at 24 weeks are afforded all the medical expertise available to ensure survival. The provision of medical intervention in ensuring this premature baby survives is never questioned despite the high possibility of deformity or long term effects.

Such political attention on Abortion is an excellent opportunity to speak with your children about the sanctity of life, about the need to protect the unborn child who has no voice and about God's Grace upon all humans. Our students are certainly aware of this public debate and in order to make sense of the mixed messages that flood our media; they need our full understanding of the value of human life. Such discussions will support and guide their own decision making and help them reach a position that also appreciates the miracle of conception, birth and life.

Welcomed response from our State Government

Over the Term 3 break, the State government struck an agreement that will see Catholic schools benefit from an extra \$38.9million. There is no doubt that this redirection has come from the unrelenting lobbying from Principals, parents and teachers. On 6th October the *Herald Sun* reported

"VICTORIA'S Catholic schools will receive an extra \$38.9 million funding after the State Government succumbed to pressure from the Archbishop and angry principals and parents. The grant for rebuilding and upgrades at needy Catholic schools will help free up money for teacher pay rises, and ease threats of fee increases and program cuts because of funding shortfalls. The Brumby Government struck the deal with the Catholic Education Office yesterday after unrest and petitions from almost 50,000 parents".

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It is important to acknowledge the participation of you the parents and families, parish priests, teachers, parishioners and CEO staff who supported the campaign which highlighted the unjust principles of funding that currently exist between schooling systems. I would like to thank parents for taking the initiative and signing the petition and for those who actually wrote letters to Members of Parliament. Unfortunately, the issue is not yet over as we move to fixing the new funding arrangement for 2010.

Memorable finish for our Year 12s.

Parents, extended family and friends are invited to participate in the *Year 12 Graduation Mass on Wednesday* **22 October at 6.00pm at St Michael's Church.** It is the last time that this group of students will come together to give thanks for their education and the opportunities presented to them. Parents who have accompanied their child to this Mass in the past have reported the surprising sense of closure that comes with this celebration for them too. It is an important and necessary transition for parents as well. We extend a genuine welcome to all parents and Year 12 students to this final celebration and farewell.
