## From the Principal

#### **Dear Parents and Students**

The International Day of Families, celebrated on the 15th May is a day observed by the United Nations honouring the importance of families throughout the world. #### **Grade 6 Visits**

The year 7 Co-ordinators, Mrs. Barrett and Ms. McCullagh, and I have visited the Grade 6 students in the Catholic primary schools. The students have responded enthusiastically. In return, the Grade 6 students have spent a morning at the campus, engaging in some classes and getting a feel for learning at Lavalla. The feedback from the students has been good.

#### **Open Day**

Open Day is always exciting. This year proved no different. It's always fun to have visitors to see the Campus at work. At reception the student guides greeted the visitors and escorted them around the campus. They also entered some classes to see the lessons in progress. As usual the visitors commented glowingly about the conduct and answers of students.

#### **Medieval Day**

On 3rd May time was reversed as Presentation Campus became a medieval place and our Year 8 students entered the Middle Ages. The aim of the day was to enrich their understanding of life in medieval Students were organised Europe. participated in activities and workshops. In Tourney, an armed Knight challenged a number of students, armed with wooden swords, to hit him. At one stage the 'knight' sat down, drank a cup of tea with one hand and beat off the challenge of the attacking students with the other. The students were startled to see that none of them could harm him, while they were easily dispatched. They understood the power of the knight. Crime, Armour, Dance, food, Fashion and Dress gave them a fascinating insight into life in medieval times. Thanks to the meticulous planning by Ms. Widrich and her team and the hospitality of the Presentation staff, the students enjoyed the learning experience.

#### **Athletics Carnival**

For the first time the athletes from the three campuses took part in the College Athletics Carnival at the Joe Carmody Athletics Track in Moe on 4 May. Altogether, over 400 hundred students participated, about 220 from St. Paul's. The general consensus is that this event was very successful; it ran smoothly and participants, especially the elite athletes, reached a high level of performance. # Lavalla Catholic College Year 7's Visit the Great Wall of China Exhibition

Throughout the month of May, over 260 Year 7 students from Lavalla Catholic College have had the opportunity to visit the Melbourne Museum and to view the Great Wall of China exhibition currently showing.

Individual classes have also taken the opportunity to explore a range of exhibits including the Bunjilaka Indigenous Exhibit, the Australia Gallery, the Southern Diversity Exhibition, Bugs Alive and the Mind and Body Galleries while at the Museum.

The highlight of these visits has been learning about the enthralling story of the many dynasties that began the walls that make up the Great Wall of China today. Students have been exposed to a rich selection of artwork and examples of ancient technology. Rare artifacts, detailed models, reproductions and multi-media presentations have entertained all visitors and have provided the students with a wealth of information and opportunities for exploration into this fascinating field of Chinese history.

Having been inspired by their Museum experience, all Year 7 classes are now planning their own museum presentations, required of students to integrate a range of skills from across the VELS curriculum.
