Global Reality Meal

On Thursday 13 March, about 50 year 9 students volunteered for the 'Global Reality Meal'. Students randomly picked different coloured stars. 6 students with gold stars sat at a well laid table and got the good meal; pizza, juice, cake, etc. They had teachers serve them and ask if they wanted more. The other 44 sat on gym mats and shared cold boiled rice, sliced bread and baked beans. The point was to experience the effects of poverty. All students found it unjust, humiliating, and divisive. They felt emotions like anger and helplessness. . Some of the 'poor' people threatened the 'rich'; others attempted to 'steal' some food. The social interaction of the two groups mirrored the great social divide. It was a timely lesson, well planned and well learned. The students showed generosity and willingness to learn.

JUNIOR STATE TOUCH FOOTY CHAMPIONS

Boys - Lavalla has won the Junior Championship for the first time in sixteen years. In the 1990s the senior teams won several championships in a row. Since then the State championships have grown from 6 teams in it's inaugural year to over 50 schools from all over Victoria.

This was the third year in the State 15yr and under competition for the Year 9 boys. They have trained during lunchtimes since Year 7 and played over the summer in the local senior Traralgon Touch A grade Competition to improve game skills. The experience was invaluable. Matt Royal and Jordan Symons also played in the Victorian team last year and the skills, experience and leadership they brought back also assisted the team.

The boys were undefeated on the day and actually won the final 8/3 against Chaffey College, Mildura. The team comprised Joel Barry, Craig Bourne (C), Nick Celima, Jack Doderico, Zac Gray, Josh Hanrahan, Tom Pattle, Joel Pirotta, Matt Royal, Jordan Symons, Mitch Aucote, Brett Hammer, and Ryan Pledge.

Girls - This was the second appearance at the state championships for the under 15 girls team. Last year they made the semi finals. Since then most of the girls have been playing in the Traralgon Touch Football Competition with different teams to gain further experience. Lunchtime training with Mr Sizeland has improved skills.

The girls lost only one game in the preliminary rounds to Mildura 2/1, and comfortably defeated their other opponents. A close win over Aquinas College, Ringwood in the semi final set-up a return match against Mildura. Once again this was a tight evenly balanced game with both teams defences dominating. Mildura scored the only try of the game to defeat Lavalla 1/0.
