From the Principal

Dear Parents and Students

The recently held *International Assembly on Marist Mission* was an inspirational, life giving and life changing experience for me personally and for the 110 international delegates who attended this conference. Participants described this as a Pentecostal experience and others saw it as an Annunciation where the spirit of the 'angel' called us to respond wholeheartedly to our mission to work with young people especially those most marginalised.

There were three significant proclamations from this conference that I would like to share with you. The first is based on the sheer magnitude of the Marist family itself. The realisation that in every continent, across 77 countries and just as many languages there are devoted and committed Marist, both lay and brothers, working to improve the lives of young people. The participants spoke of the conversion of the heart that occurs when one listens to God's voice in guiding our work. Amongst the obvious diversity of cultures, languages and Christian traditions that confronted us each day, the strongest thread that united us was our core faith expressed through our love for children.





Secondly, the idea that as Marist we are all responsible for the promotion of vocational life became a dawning realisation. We realised that there is a continuing and increasing need to keep alive Champagnat's charism and that vocational life in today's world might look quite different than it has in the past. We discussed implications for the way we live in our families and in our communities and in our formation as Marists and people of faith.

The third most profound discovery was the ground swell commitment for the defence of the rights of children as an advancement and development of the Marist apostolate. There exists in the Marist organisation the Bureau of International Solidarity (BIS). This organisation is involved with international organisations in advocating for the human rights of children, especially their right to education and their welfare. Since July of 2005, the Marist Brothers have found a voice before the United Nations human rights agencies in Geneva. This Assembly was able to ignite world wide interest and commitment to this important advocacy work.

The Superior General, Br Sean Sammon in his closing remarks summed up this 10 day conference like this:
