From the Principal

Dear Parents and Students

On Sunday 27 May we celebrated *Pentecost Sunday*, the festival which recognises the gift of the Holy Spirit. Sometimes it is also referred to as the 'Birthday of the Church', marking the beginning of the Church's mission for all humanity. On the same day we celebrated the *40th anniversary of the 1967 Referendum* on Indigenous people and the Australian Constitution. History has recorded this as the most successful referendum and a most defining event on record with more than 90% of Australians voting 'yes' to count Aboriginal and Torres Straight Islanders Australian in the census and giving the Commonwealth Government powers to make specific laws in respect of Indigenous people. Some Historians refer to this outstanding victory as the 'Birth of the Reconciliation Movement'.

This referendum was a landmark not only because of the overwhelming 'yes' vote but also because it finally recognised the rightful place of Indigenous Australians in our country. It was an impetus for Government action in granting land rights, improved protection of Aboriginal rights and increased provision of certain services. It carried with it the hopes of a Nation for a fair-go for our indigenous people.

Now 40 years down the track, we become blasé about another media report that highlights continued injustices, inequalities, lost opportunities and deeply ingrained disadvantages for our Indigenous people? Overwhelming the Referendum showed that we were supportive of the Government mandate to take responsibility but how many of us take personal responsibility for what is happening to the most marginalise group in our community? As a First World country why don't we feel more shame about the fact that a large proportion of our Indigenous people are living below Third World conditions and not taking their place in the 21st Century?

As members of this Democracy based on Christian values we are called to take action for Social Justice and speak out against inequality but the silence is deafening when it comes to our most disadvantaged group of people. Pope Benedict XVI has recently reminded us that Christians are called to 'assumes their specific political and social responsibilities' and 'to work courageously within our world to bring about that renewal of relationships which has its exhaustible source of God's gift". Each one of us needs to be committed to Aboriginal rights because not to do so would make us negligent of our Catholic and Christian responsibilities.
