Leading Australia's Schools programme is a challenging national leadership development



program for principals from across Australia. Its aim is to build the professional knowledge and leadership skills of school principals to increase their capacity to lead schools effectively in the 21st century. The programme is delivered by the University of Melbourne in partnership with Teaching Australia. Each year, two cohorts of about 40 principals participated in the program, which involves a residential component and an individual challenge project. I am fortunate to have been selected this year and the first residential component commences on Sunday 26 April for a week and then again in July for three days. I am looking forward to learning first hand about the latest research on leading schools and then applying it to our own community.

Marist Province Conference

In 1807, Bishop Daniel Delaney of Kildare and Leighlin responded to the hardships of the penal days in Ireland by establishing the Congregation of the Sisters of Saint Brigid. The Brigidines focussed on the need for education and revitalizing the faith. Bishop Delany planted a sapling from the oak tree at St. Brigid's abbey in Kildare to show that the work of St. Brigid had sprouted again. Delany House, the Kildare Campus and the Oak tree are visible signs of the Brigidine charism at work in the history and life of Lavalla Catholic College.

Year 7 Information Evening
