PUNCTUALITY

It was probably while I was attending a course in Switzerland that I learnt something more about punctuality. Trains actually arrive and depart on time, the payment of bills is rarely late, and people even turn up early. I am not sure whether this has something to do with the Swiss clock industry, but living there was a constant reminder that punctuality is a habit that respects other people's time and a discipline that gives shape to our day.

One of my current concerns is that there are a number of students who are turning up late.

Our computer records show that Kildare Campus students have about 7% of students late, Presentation Campus has 4% late and St Paul's Campus about 3% late.

I have noticed that those who live further away are more likely to be on time than those who live closer. The buses are punctual and there is usually no problem with students who travel by bus. What we have is usually stragglers dawdling along the street and a few parent-driven cars rushing in at the last minute, which usually results in the student being late.

I don't mean to be unsympathetic to the task of getting young people moving in the morning, but I do need to remind you that students must be in homeroom, (not at the front gate) by 8.50 AM

Commencement of the year:
