Final Assembly – Year 12:

Last week Mr. Judd and I hosted the final assembly for Year 12. It was with just a touch of sadness that we all realised that not only is the end of the year very close, but also that by the end of the exams, many students may never again meet. On the other hand, there was the elation of the feeling that the end of a busy year was about to arrive and soon all the hard work of Year 12 would be over.

There was, however, another reason for holding such an assembly. With the end of the year come the inevitable parties and celebrations of a long journey taken together. We all viewed a video "Muck Up Day" which followed the misfortunes of a tragedy that occurred at Frankston in 1999 on the evening of the last day of school. Sergeant Chris Pegg from the Traralgon Police spoke about young drivers and their inexperience, about avoidable tragedies, about partying and the responsible use of alcohol and about programs that the Victoria Police have in place as a protection for the general public, especially school leavers.

I also outlined to the students that the end of the year was not a time for irresponsible behaviour. I asked all to respect the College property and to make sure that they found the time to thank their teachers before leaving. I outlined the consequences of irresponsible behaviour and reminded the students that a letter was sent home last week reinforcing the need for sensible behaviour.

Therefore, any property damage will be met with involvement by the Police and charges will be laid. Offenders will also be responsible for paying for any damage caused. They may not be permitted to sit exams at the College; the College reference will be withdrawn. Students not doing the right thing may be denied permission to attend the last days' activities and may be denied permission to attend the Graduation Mass and Supper Dance. Worst of all, people doing silly things will have damaged the good reputation of the year level.

I advised all students that on Thursday, when it was time to go home, to do just that. I do not want to see people hoon off in cars, or speed up and down Kosciuszko Street where there is a speed limit of 40 kph, or throw things at pedestrians or other students, or wet them with water pistols. I hoped that students would enjoy Thursday night in a responsible fashion and spend the last week seriously preparing for the exams.


