From the Principal's Desk

Dear parents and students

In the words of our Prime Minister Mr Kevin Rudd, Wednesday 13 February – Sorry Day was a 'great day for the Nation'. It was also a great day for Lavalla Catholic College. The whole community, in a respectful and dignified manner, marked the significance of the occasion by proudly raising the Aboriginal flag. At Assemblies, our students spent time in silent reflection to acknowledge the pain suffered by generations of broken families as a result of government policies. The words that matter the most are these:

We apologise for the laws and policies of successive Parliaments and governments that have inflicted profound grief, suffering and loss on these our fellow Australians.

We apologise especially for the removal of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children from their families, their communities and their country.

For the pain, suffering and hurt of these Stolen Generations, their descendants and for their families left behind, we say sorry.

To the mothers and the fathers, the brothers and the sisters, for the breaking up of families and communities, we say sorry.

And for the indignity and degradation thus inflicted on a proud people and a proud culture, we say sorry.

This apology sits well with our Catholic Tradition and I share with you a reflection from Pope Benedict XVI in a paper he wrote in 2005 entitled *God is Love*, which although not written in this context reminds us that our unconditional love of God by implication necessitates us to take action against injustices towards humanity: He says,

The unbreakable bond between love of God and love of neighbour must be emphasised. One is so closely connected to the other that to say we love God becomes a lie if we are closed to our neighbour or hate them altogether. St John's words should rather be interpreted to mean that love of neighbour is a path that leads to the encounter with God, and that closing our eyes to our neighbour also blinds us to God.

Everyone recognises that this apology is an important first step only and that we now need to face many challenges before we can confidently

say that the conditions of our indigenous people are in parity with the rest of Australia. The apology brought great hope to our nation and to our indigenous people. Let us pray that in this humbling experience we do not lose sight of the hard work that now needs to come.

Education Maintenance Allowance Eligibility

The Education Maintenance Allowance is paid to eligible parents of students under 16 years of age who attend a State or a Registered School in Victoria.

The Education Maintenance Allowance will be paid in two instalments and to be eligible you must on the first day of 1st Term (29 January 2008) for the first instalment and on the first day of 3rd Term (14 July 2008) for the second instalment:

- (a) be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004: OR
- (b) be a Veteran Affairs Pensioner (TPI), OR
- (c) be a foster parent and
- (d) submit your application to the school by the date/s listed.

Submission dates

The application form must be lodged at the school by:

29 February 2008 for the first instalment or 1 August 2008 for the second instalment.

Important Information

A separate application is required for each school if you have children attending different schools. If you transfer your child, you will need to make a new application at the new school. All staff are required to treat the information that you provide as confidential.
