Dear Members of Lavalla Catholic College community

After twenty-seven years, the College will begin the new academic year in 2014 without the vibrant and wise presence of Erica Pegorer. This letter bears the news that Ms Pegorer will be concluding her time at Lavalla at the end of this year in order to take on a new position.

Ms Pegorer has been appointed as the national Executive Officer of Kildare Ministries, the Church organisation which carries on the educational and community work of the Brigidine Sisters across Australia. It is an important role for which she has been engaged and we certainly offer her warmest congratulations on being chosen for it.

Lavalla Catholic College, and its antecedent schools, have been the focus of Ms Pegorer's life and work for so many years, it is a little difficult to imagine the College without her. She has made an immense contribution to the ministry of Catholic education in the Diocese of Sale, and deserves the deep appreciation from everyone for all that she has invested of herself in her various responsibilities, most especially that of College Principal over the last eight years. More broadly in the Marist community, she has also been extensively involved on a range of councils, committees and other initiatives, not only within the Province of Australia but internationally across the Marist world.

Marist Schools Australia will be moving immediately to begin the recruitment and appointment process for the next Principal of Lavalla Catholic College. This will be done in cooperation with the Diocese of Sale. We would expect to attract a high quality Catholic educational leader to take up the reins of the College. As part of the process, there will be formal consultation with the staff and the broader College community in order to identify your hopes and aspirations for the next chapter in the story of Lavalla. I invite you to take up the opportunity that this consultation will afford.

#### Girls through to State Semi Final in AFL

Lavalla Catholic College's junior girls Australian Football team endured a woeful day of high winds and chilly temperatures last Friday at Dandenong North to win through to the State Final which will be played at Victoria Park on Monday, August 26th.

Lavalla withstood the strong opposition they opposed in Catholic College Wodonga, Norwood Secondary College and Frankston High School to remain undefeated at the SSV State Semi Finals to become the first girl's football team from Lavalla to win through to the State Final.

With high winds blowing from goal to goal, Lavalla produced a come-from-behind victory over Norwood to win by four points in a tight and tense finish. Use of the wind in the last quarter was almost negated by all players being situated in Lavalla's forward line but the girls were able to score a goal and secure the win.

Frankston again made Lavalla work to have to pull off another come-from-behind victory, this time winning by 10 points. Our straight kicking for goal during this match was a decisive factor in the win as both teams had the same number of scoring shots.

The final match of the day and Lavalla's game tactics were almost derailed when Wodonga chose to kick into the wind in the first quarter meaning we would not be coming home with the wind in the final term. However, a couple of positional changes sparked Lavalla during the third quarter which enabled our girls to establish a significant advantage after a dominant quarter of football. The lead was maintained and Lavalla was celebrating a 27-point triumph by the end of the match.

**Emily Haesler** was Lavalla's player of the day with **Casey Sherriff** a close second but overall each player produced solid efforts when required throughout the day and the team has a good chance of success when they travel to Abbotsford for the State Final.
