Dear Parents, students and staff,

We have had an excellent start to the third term. After a very productive staff development day examining the integration of ICT across the curriculum on 12th July at the Presentation Campus, students seem to have settled back into the routine of classes and studying and each campus felt like it was ready for business as usual. It is obvious that our Year 12 students are certainly aware that they have entered into their last 10 weeks and for the moment they appear calm and focused. There is a positive energy around the College.

I have experienced many proud moments as Principal and this week it happened again. Our choir performed their original piece, 'Gunnai Dreaming' at the Latrobe Performing Arts Centre on Wednesday night. They sang it with such respect for the Aboriginal culture and their performance stirred in people a deep sense of emotion. The audience was left speechless. Many remarked about its power and impact. The piece sung, told of the dreamtime story of **Boran** the pelican and **Tuk** the musk duck, the first Gunnai to come to Gippsland. One of Australia's finest composers, Mark Clement Pollard was commissioned by the College to write this highly evocative work. Mark worked in close consultation with **Lynette Solomon-Dent** and **Christine Johnstone** from the Central Gippsland TAFE Koori unit. As a College we feel this has been a wonderful gift and are proud to have in a small way, furthered our relationship with the Braiakaulung people of the Gunnai/Kurnai clan and their history. The performance that followed by **Kutch Edwards** was equally emotional and a powerful and provocative rendition of his life as an Aboriginal person growing up in Melbourne and Traralgon. In the great tradition of oral history, Kutch captured his life story full of sadness, pain, family love and hope. It will be a night not easily forgotten.

Faith & Ministry

When I was ten, my grandmother passed away quite suddenly. I remember all too well the difficult task sometime after her funeral when the entire extended family assembled to pack up her belongings and prepare her home to be sold. A great mob of uncles, aunts and cousins gathered with boxes and bags at her home one weekend. It was a bittersweet occasion with stories and memories being triggered by the possessions being packed up. Most items had a story that could be expanded upon by one or more of those gathered. Some, to this day, remain an enigmatic mystery.

Our beloved 'Gran' had a sturdy, pragmatic faith that continues to echo through our family. Amongst her belongings, my uncle found a scribbled note with the heading "My prayer". While I have long since forgotten the details of this prayer, I do remember one line that I continue to reflect on. I also remember the impact of this find on our family. My uncle had access to a computer at his work (which was a big deal then) and he typed up and copied this prayer for all to share in. It was just the tonic needed for a family that was somewhat adrift without their magnificent matriarch. The final lines of her prayer were:

*"Lord, help me to remember that I will face nothing today that you and I cannot handle,
Please help me as you always have, I love you"*

Twenty three years later. I still envy my Gran for her remarkable trust in God. This was revealed in many ways, not just the faithful confidence that the lines above speak to. She had the type of wisdom that only the passage of time can bring. However, I am still struck all these years later about the trust that existed in her relationship with God.

The notion of trusting God has been in my thoughts lately. Mainly, because I am realising that faith in God doesn't immediately mean an automatic trust in God. I am inspired by those who like my Gran have a faith that reaches such a point. My favourite example of this trust in God occurs in the gospels with the visceral image of the disciples leaving their nets upon the shore and following Jesus in his mission as

he promised to make them 'fishers of men'.

My own conversations with God show nowhere near the comfortable trust that my Gran had. I pray that someday they will.

We also welcome new staff members **Miss Alexandra James** and **Mr Sunil Nand** who both have duties in the MSP program as well as within the Campus.

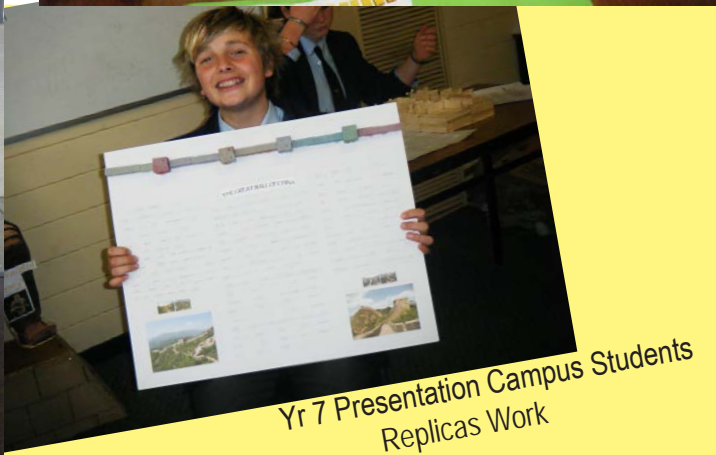

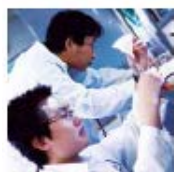

SEMESTER 2 BEGINS . . .

It is a timely reminder to all students that there are a number of things they can do to help achieve their academic goals:

1. Re read Semester 1 reports in order to identify areas which require improvement. These may include organisation, attentiveness or even attendance.
2. Be familiar with the home study documents which are made available at the beginning of each Semester or term (depending on Year level). Recommended tasks for home study will include pre reading relevant information (novels/texts), reviewing and rewriting class notes and planning and producing research tasks.
3. Be an active member of your learning group (class). Prepare for lessons, aim to meet due dates and discuss your progress with your teacher.
4. Stay healthy by not staying up late and eating foods with little nutritional value. Eat a healthy breakfast before coming to school in the morning and make time for physical activity if you are not involved in an organised sport.

Students have chosen to produce a model or publication or plan and conduct an experiment on a topic relating to the environment. Funding for Catholic Schools

With the Federal election now called and the State election only months away it is important for us all to keep this very significant issue at the forefront of the political agenda. You will remember that last year we ran the very real risk of not being considered in the State government funding review. We are yet to be confident that our Prime Minister, Ms Julia Gillard will increase the Federal Government funding to Catholic Schools either. Those of us who try to manage Catholic schools are quite perplexed at the obvious inequity towards Catholic schools. For example, Victorian Catholic schools have received the lowest level of state government funding of any state in Australia. As a result, for each dollar of federal and state government funding going to a student in a Victorian government school, a student in a Catholic school receives just 63 cents. We are asking that State funding to Catholic schools be transparently linked to 25% of the cost of education in a Victorian government school. On our webpage you will find accurate factual information that might help you address your concerns with our local Members. I encourage you to write to the papers and our local MPs because we know that they certainly listen to the voice of the people, especially during an election year. 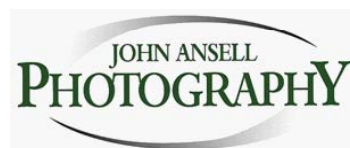
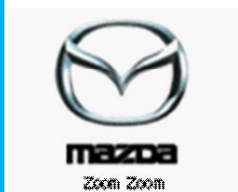
