Australian Brain Bee Challenge

On Friday 16 March Ashleigh Dyer, Jessica Edwards and Quinn McGennisken attended the state semi-final of the Australian Brain Bee Challenge, a neuroscience competition. The venue was the Bio21 Molecular Science and Biotechnology Institute, a research centre affiliated with the University of Melbourne.

After an address by Prof. Fred Mendelsohn, two preliminary rounds of the competition followed. *Jessica Edwards* and *Quinn McGennisken* made it through to the final round.

The third round, and the Individual Final, was ultimately won by *Quinn McGennisken*, who was indeed challenged by highly complex questions. Quinn was acclaimed as the *State Finalist* for Victoria and was presented with a Nikon digital camera valued at around \$600. *Jessica Edwards* was third and received a monetary prize. Quinn will now prepare for the National Final to be held in July as part of the International Brain Research Organisation Meeting.

The girls also represented Lavalla in the Team Challenge. The questions were projected one at a time onto a large screen, and the contestants had 20 seconds to confer in order to generate each response. Our girls maintained their composure, and emerged the victors. Their reward this time was winning a microscope valued at about \$1,600 from Zeiss, the major sponsor of the event. The microscope will be for student use in the Science Department at the Kildare Campus.

Congratulations to our three ambassadors, not only for their success, but because of the spirit in which they entered the Challenge. They were positive and motivated throughout. Mrs Bormanis was more than a little proud of the girls. Her dedication to this competition and our students is commendable. Congratulations Mrs Bormanis, Ahleigh, Quinn and Jessica.

Palm Sunday Launch of World Youth Day

World Youth Day is being held in Sydney in 2008. Over 500,000 young people are expected to attend the celebrations during July and be at Randwick Racecourse when the Pope arrives to celebrate Mass. Our College will be sending representatives to the WYD.

In preparation for WYD the Diocese of Sale is holding a special pilgrimage from the Sion Convent site to the Cathedral on Palm Sunday, **April 1st** of this year.

As the pilgrimage to the Cathedral takes place the pilgrims will stop and pray the 'Stations of the Cross' at fourteen different places along the way. Lavalla is staging the dramatic presentation of stations 3 and 4. The pilgrimage makes its way to the Cathedral where the Bishop will celebrate Mass with the pilgrims.

There will be a BBQ lunch followed by performances from live bands, an art exhibition and presentations on WYD. This festival aspect will conclude at 5.30pm.

Family groups are invited to attend. The College will be well represented at this pilgrimage and our involvement will be a vital part of the initial preparations for WYD Students.

Project Compassion

This year Project Compassion focussed on Bangladesh and making the poor self reliant through the cultivation of fish farms. Felix Rosario, of Caritas Bangladesh, spoke to our students at the launch of Project Compassion at the Campus in late February.

Most Homerooms, ably supported by their teachers, have organised an event or activity to raise funds. SRCs and Student Leaders collect and count the money raised every week. And a little respect." All the students were exhorted to accept each other as they are and stand up for their rights.
