Dear Parents and Students

On Tuesday night, the 15th November, the launch of *Journeying Together in Hope* – the new Religious Education curriculum across all primary and secondary levels was launched. It was a most significant and joyful celebration with Principals, Religious Education Coordinators, other Leadership members and student leaders all coming together at a special mass, celebrated by our Bishop, Jeremiah Coffey. This new curriculum programme ensures consistency in the standard and the approach in the teaching of religious education and provides a valuable framework upon which our values and faith can be built.

The busyness and urgency of things has increased and we are especially focused on ensuring that students remain focused and present.
