Similarly at the end of term, records will be checked for academic performance. I am bringing this to your attention because given the good will of all parties we will still be able to remedy most situations.

Subject Selections (2007)

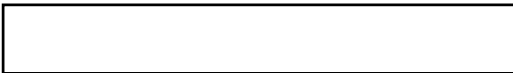
