Dear Parents,

This week we are sending out letters detailing absence from roll calls, lateness and unexplained daily absence. Attendance is an issue because for some the law says it is or makes it so. The electronic system that we have installed to check attendance is specifically designed to track anyone who fails to be at the required place at the required time. Like all electronic checks, it is insistent and unrelenting and rarely makes errors. If students don't do what is required, the system will catch them in a way that no teacher would have the time to do. All this is a part of a two-way accountability whereby students are accountable for maximum school attendance and the College is responsible for providing the courses and programmes which make up its educational offering.

The system gives us a full list of students who breached either punctuality or attendance without any explanation being offered. We are informing parents of these breaches asking them to acknowledge them and, if possible, offer an explanation.

Records of who is and who is not in school have always been kept. But over the past decade, there has been a rise in non-attendance levels, particularly around Years 8, 9 and 10, where students and parents are legally bound to ensure attendance.

Research is showing that failure to be in school long enough or often enough to gain the required skills and knowledge has personal and social costs. Poor results, deteriorating peer relationships, unemployment, poverty, and criminal activity can often be linked to poor attendance.

The "why's" of absenteeism are as important as the "how often's" and it is sometimes wise to find the reason. Is it peer pressure, anxiety about course deadlines, fear of bullying, dislike of particular lessons or particular teachers, excessive home responsibilities or weak reading skills??

I hope that the information results in improved punctuality and attendance.
