We began the semester with an extremely successful College Assembly where we were able to celebrate the academic and sporting achievements of many students. The College is very proud of and warmly congratulates our Year 11 student, *Quinn McGennisken* on winning the Brain Bee Australasia competition. This prestigious and competitive event draws interest from around Australia and New Zealand and the final four came down to Quinn and three other students from New Zealand. Quinn has been competing in the various stages of this challenge since the beginning of the year and continued to study diligently in preparation for the final round. She maintained her concentration and calmness under arduous conditions and was rewarded with a placement in the international competition in Baltimore USA next March. Congratulations to Quinn, her family and her teacher Mrs Bormanis.

We were also able to celebrate the outstanding achievements of our gifted and talented sporting students. Three boys are representing Australia at the highest level in their sport. We congratulate *Daniel Barry* in Year 12 who is ranked 3rd in the World in the Jet Skiing competition and *Joel Barry* in Year 8 who is ranked 1st in the Junior Championships in the same sport. Their ranking improved after their successful participation in the championship in Queensland last month and they will represent Australia in America later this year. *Matthew Mofatt* in Year 10 as the National Singles Champion of Australia will compete in the World under 18/23 Bocce Championships in Dardilly France from 11th - 15th September. Matt has been competing at this level for three years and last year experienced the high standard of international competition when he was also selected to compete in Italy. Also very exciting for the College is the announcement that *Mrs Lisa Williams* is a finalist in the Victorian Sun-Herald Teacher of the Year Awards. Mrs Williams has been nominated for the *Graduate Teacher of the Year Award*. After being short listed Mrs Williams attended an interview earlier in the month and was selected as a finalist by a panel of educationalists. The criteria for selection required that she demonstrate a commitment to student learning, positive relationships with the school community and effective teaching practice in the classroom.
