Australian Marist Netball Carnival

The 11th Australian Marist Netball Carnival was hosted by Our Lady of the Sacred Heart College in Alice Springs, NT from May 15 – 18. Seventeen Marist Colleges from around Australia participated in this exclusive event. Lavalla's senior netball team consisting of Deanne Cocksedge (c), Lisa Yates (vc), Stacey O'Brien, Laura Pickering, Caitie Mitchell, Sarah Scholtes, Carly Williamson, Rachael Loechel and Carly Jennings played 13 matches over the three days of play. After qualifying into the Championship division they were required to complete against the other 8 championship teams in a round robin tournament.

Overall their championship win:loss record was 4 wins, 2 draws and 2 losses, which was good enough to scrape into 3rd position on percentage over Sacred Heart, Adelaide. St John's Woodlawn, Lismore finished top and qualified straight through to the final, so we were left to fight out the semi-final against Catholic College Bendigo. We were very excited to reach the semi-final after two roller coaster days of netball, but played outstanding against a strong Bendigo side and got up by 6 goals. The grand final played on Wednesday morning against St John's promised great things and Lavalla delivered. Having made the final last year we were able to calm our nerves early and get the upper hand. The girls remained solid throughout the pressure filled game, consolidating turnovers and taking full advantage of all opportunities, winning by 3 goals. This would mark the first time CRC/Lavalla has ever won the Marist Netball Carnival in the 9 years that we have competed.
