### Subject Selection Processes

Families are encouraged to take advantage of all the assistance provided throughout the term while students engage in decision making relating to subject choices in their re-enrolment. Subject handbooks for Years 9-12 are a very useful source for contacts and key dates. The EXPO on 4<sup>th</sup> August aims to cover a range of services and is an invaluable step in this process.
