A LIFE-LONG LEARNING COMMUNITY

The pleasure of learning is not restricted to our students. Our Professional Development motto is "Lavalla Catholic College promotes a Life-Long Learning Community'. Through the professional-learning programme, teachers have a positive orientation to life-long learning and they attempt to embrace new ways thinking about teaching and learning and about developing an active learning community. Ultimately, as teachers we try to model a 'learning' approach to adult life and as lifelong learners ourselves we are both learners and teachers.

Already this year, almost 20% of staff members have attended Professional Learning activities. As a result you might hear that teachers are absent from classes. Teachers ensure that the flow of lessons is not interrupted and we are sure that you are supportive of this extra commitment from the staff to stay up-to-date and relevant for the benefit of our students.

Mind Matters+ is a comprehensive 'well-being' programme that promotes resilience, connectedness and developmental growth. A core of very active teachers from the St Paul's and Presentation campuses are designing programmes that can be used during the pastoral care periods. We are part of a government funded pilot programme that

allows us to pool resources with 17 other schools around Australia. Teachers have attended Professional Development activities in Sydney and Melbourne and meet fortnightly to ensure the programme is on target.

Together with the local Catholic Primary Schools, teachers from the St Paul's and Presentation campuses are part of the *Science and Environmental Education for the Middle Years* in a Latrobe Valley Catholic Cluster. This group is focusing on enhancing our year 5 to year 8 students' awareness of 'ecological sustainability' through organising school based activities and curriculum programmes.

Teacher of the Year Awards

Two years ago, we were fortunate to have 6 nominations for and one winner of the Teacher of the Year awards. These awards recognise excellence, commitment and innovation in teaching.
