The sessions will be held on the **8th** and **9th November 2005** over two periods and will incorporate the following: alerting students to the dangers of drink spiking that can lead to sexual assault; problem solving and protective strategies young people can use to reduce the possible risks.

The program was developed to address young people prior to them being legally able to enter licensed venues so that when they do they will know how to keep themselves safe from possible predators. If any parent/guardian does not wish their child to participate please ring Sandy Francois, Counsellor at St Paul's Campus. This is very timely as the festive season approaches and some Yr 9 students will be in situations where alcohol may become an issue. While the topics maybe a little confronting it is better to give our young people information rather than hope that the issues will go away. I thank Sandy for making these arrangements for us.
