No doubt you are aware that the Church has two new saints. Whilst it is not unique for a Pope to become a saint it is extraordinary to have two of living memory to be canonised on the same day. John XXIII began the process of momentous change and renewal in the Catholic Church - Vatican II. John Paul II was pontiff through a period of significant world change that included the momentous changes in the political and human rights changes in Eastern Europe, South Africa as well as Central and South America. There is no doubt both these men have made significant contributions to quality of relationships between people throughout the world.

I want to commend to your prayers Mr Andrew Harrison who passed away last week. Andrew was a teacher at St Vincent de Paul Primary School in Morwell and he taught a number of students who are now at Lavalla Catholic College. My gratitude is extended to Mrs Therese Main who attended on behalf of the College, along with 30 students and number of parents, at the celebration mass for Andrew Harrison's life at Sacred Heart Parish. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Finally, I offer you the following Post-Easter Reflection: *Easter celebrates not only the resurrection of one man, but the resurrection of the whole human race. Perhaps this is the full meaning of the term 'son of man', so important to the gospel writers: Jesus is the new generation of humanity, a new humanity ... By proclaiming his resurrection now (not at the end of time), we are inviting people everywhere to join him – in a new birth, as part of a new humanity, celebrating a new covenant, to walk 'in newness of life'. We are saying, 'You don't have to wait for some distant future to start practising kindness, non-violence, reconciliation, reverence, joy, hope, neighbourliness, and peace. You can leave the old humanity behind and start practising this new humanity now.* (Brian McLaren) I also suggest this is an appropriate reflection in light of the canonisation of our John XXIII and John Paul II and particularly ANZAC Day last Friday, recalling the sacrifices that so many have made which allow us the opportunity to live in peace and to promote peace in our world.

The term has started with considerable activity at St Paul's as staff and students immediately engage the curriculum challenges. At Year 9 in particular, the Atlas program at our Presentation Campus launched with preparative work for City and Surf camps to come at locations in both Warragul and at Birmingham Park. As well, four classes spent time photographing Historical sites in Melbourne on a 'Marvellous Melbourne' excursion. Meanwhile, Year 7 students have been up close and personal with a range of reptiles in connection with their science studies.

A number of our Year 7 students were given the opportunity to represent the school as ambassadors over the past week as they visited their old primary schools to speak to the current grade six students about life at secondary school. It is always fascinating to witness students counselling others about the differences particular to alternate settings. Questions from the grade six students ranged from queries about the use of technology through the food items available from the canteen. Our Year 7 students presented beautifully and did a wonderful job of making the transition process accessible to their grade six friends. I thank our transition team and Adriana Bianconi who did a brilliant job of facilitating the discussion between new and prospective Lavalla students.

NAPLAN testing will be conducted for Year 7 AND Year 9 students on May 13, 14 and 15 at St Paul's. Students are being familiarised with the format of this testing process and are being presented small daily challenges by our Campus Learning Leader, Ms Claire Couling in order to sharpen their appreciation of the process.

We continue to have success in all of our sporting endeavours at Lavalla. Last week, at SSV state Swimming Championships, with a small squad, Lavalla finished 4th of the out of the 365 schools represented throughout the state – a fantastic result. Our golf team, which included a number of senior players advanced to finals, the boys involved having opportunity to play on one of the best courses on offer in Melbourne, and, all but one of our Six SSV Tennis teams marched on toward finals

appearance. Preparations are well in hand to take winter sports by storm as teams train for Football, Soccer and Netball competition.

Thankyou to all parents and students for the smooth transition to our Winter Uniform requirement. In general, the uniform has been worn correctly and with pride, indicating a real solidarity among our students and support from our parents.

expensive and exclusive schools to achieve academic excellence. Shannon was one of only three students to achieve a Premier’s Award within all the schools in Gippsland and the only student from a Traralgon school to achieve this accolade.

As we approach the next Assessment Cycle, I ask all students to ensure that they are preparing for exam preparation tasks and exam experiences in the form of trial exams.
