Marist Brothers Beatified - Sunday 28th October

At the Champagnat Mass in August this year I spoke with the students about the Spanish Marist Brothers. In the early hours of the 8th October 1936 44 brothers were shot dead . As young as 19 years of age - intellectuals, expert teachers and poets did everything possible to remain faithful to the children and young people of Spain entrusted to their care. Victims of the religious persecutions that took place in Spain during the 1930's, these men are now recognised by our Church as martyrs, heroic witnesses to the Good News of Jesus Christ. On Sunday October 28th, 2007 we acknowledge and celebrate the beatification of the Marist martyrs by Pope Benedict XVI at the Basilica of St Paul's in Rome.

Psychology students at Lavalla Catholic College (Traralgon) did a survey last week and found 45 per cent of respondents (aged 17 to 68, with a mean age of 40) preferred Mr Howard as PM and 42 per cent supported Mr Rudd. The remaining 13 per cent had no preference.
