St Paul's Campus

The Year 9s are straining at the leash, just waiting to finish and go on to the next phase of their education; the waiting is the hardest part. The Year 8s are waiting to take over as the top dogs. The Year 7s have found their feet and are spreading their wings. Teachers balance these emotional changes and desires and encourage students to focus on learning. Term 4 is fascinating.

The wearing of uniforms is much better and we are grateful to parents for their support. In time, I am hoping that uniforms will be a non-issue and a sign that the children are amenable to the more important task of learning.

We now need to tackle mobile phones to ensure our children are safe and learning to use them wisely. We have noticed a small number of students sending and receiving inappropriate text messages, using social exclusion tactics and sending and receiving inappropriate pictures. Bluetooth is easily misused. Sometimes mobile phones are used to secretly video situations and people and the footage posted on the internet.

The campus practice has worked successfully for a number of years. Children are safe on the campus; they should concentrate on learning in the classroom and talking, running, playing with their friends during recess and lunch. The Front Office phones can be used for any urgent communication between parents and children. **Mobile phones are not required at all in school.** The students know that.

If a child is observed using a mobile phone it will be confiscated and kept at the Office until the parent/s claim it

For repeat offenders, I strongly advise parents to leave the phone at the Office for a longer period of time. The third time the phone is confiscated for a Term, the phone will be returned at the end of the Term.

To prevent misuse and confiscation, students can leave their phones at the Office at the beginning of the day and pick them up at the end of the day. In that way they will have their phones kept safely and they will be able to use them after school.

Year 9 Retreats

As part of their development, the Year 9 students will participate in an all-day retreat On 29th and 30th October, conducted by the National Youth Retreat Team. In the past the students have entered into the Retreat enthusiastically and experienced an insight into themselves and life.
