### Dear parents and students

The launch of *Project Compassion* held at the St Paul's Campus on Tuesday and the liturgies held on each campus for Ash Wednesday have prepared us well to enter into the most holy period of the Church. We were very fortunate that Bishop Jeremiah Coffey was able to be present on Tuesday, as were many representatives from other Catholic primary and secondary schools in the area. Our local Parish Priests are always supportive during these occasions and we are grateful that they were able to give of their time so generously. Two representatives from Caritas Australia gave vivid examples of this year's project compassion theme – Compassion in Action which sits very well with the College's theme of *One Heart: One Mission*. For a short while on Tuesday we were able to join together from different walks of life, different Catholic schools and different ministries as one voice to pray against continued poverty, violence and injustice that many experience in the world. We were reminded that in the Eight Millennium Goals set in the year 2000, the United Nations resolved to half world poverty by 2015 and by actively contributing to Project Compassion we become part of this global concern - this international movement to solve world poverty. We stood together as one working towards the one common goal. Both symbolically and in reality it was a moving and powerful expression of a faith community in action.

We welcomed the Queen's Baton on Wednesday morning and the parade was well attending and well organised. Thanks to all those parents who co-operated with the organisation of it by ensuring the early arrival of their children.

### KILDARE CAMPUS

### **Parent Access:**

Early in the week, the asphalt was laid in the area opposite the Chapel, also at the southern gate entrance and at the drop-off and pick-up loop adjacent to the Virtual Services Centre. Now that the roadworks are completed, it will be possible for parents to drop their sons and daughters off in the morning and to pick them up again at the end of the day by entering through the southern gate, continuing to the loop, stopping briefly to drop off or pick up and continue back through the southern gateway. Pedestrians do not use the roadway, but students who travel to and from school by bicycle are regular users of the road and parents will need to exercise caution when travelling along the road. Speed along this roadway is best kept at less than 20 km/h.

The roadway to the drop-off and pick-up loop is not a parking area. Access to Marcellin House, services

vehicles, delivery vans, administration cars and teacher traffic all use this southern entrance and it is a relatively busy thoroughfare. It is expected that the traffic in the morning and then again in the afternoon will only stop to allow the passengers of those vehicles to get off or get into the vehicle in the loop and do so in a very short time. Please be patient, as we all get used to the new system.

### "A Cause Worth Shaving For"
