

From the Principal

Dear parents, students and teachers

It was such a privilege to be on pilgrimage with fellow Marists and to explore the wonders of the Holy Land and Marcellin Champagnat's birthplace in France. We walked in the footsteps of Jesus and Mary and we immersed ourselves in scripture that made the Gospels come to life. In France we paid homage to Marcellin and his great work and it was particularly heartening to see that Marcellin's first school in the small village of Lavalla is still operational as a primary school. Pope Francis, who has captured our imagination by his humble presence, gave his usual audience to over 120,000 people from every which nationality. St Peter's square was at capacity and people were openly joyous at seeing him.

While the overall experience of the pilgrimage was wonderful there were times when we felt the sadness that divides Israel. The country where Jesus did much of his great work, is in the modern day, torn by historical disputes and visibly divided by



concrete walls, barbed wire and armed soldiers who patrol the parameters of the West Bank. In Jerusalem we Catholics were a minority group and while as tourists we did not feel adversely affected, Christians who live there certainly do. We promised to pray for a day when Jews, Muslims and Christians can live in peaceful coexistence, free from concrete walls that imprison. As a group we were never in danger but it was not too difficult to see that the situation is

very vulnerable and complex but the 'hope' in it is that the majority are working for peace.

I feel refreshed and renewed in my mission to make Jesus Known and Loved. Each day, staff at this College look for opportunities to show students that God is alive. They live by Jesus' example in the hope that our students will be captured by God's awe.

For the first time our senior jazz students are travelling to Mt Gambier to compete in the Jazz festival this weekend. There has been many hours of preparation and organisation to ensure our students are in good spirits and good form for the travel and the competition. We wished them well on their first Jazz Festival competition as they headed off at 6am today (Friday).

Each year, one or two individuals are chosen to receive an award in each category. Below are extracts from the nominations of the 2013 award recipients:

Faith

These awards seek to identify individuals who have made a significant contribution to the development of students' faith lives. It may include exemplary work in Religious Education, parish involvement, the school's spiritual life, social justice or day-to-day exemplification of Gospel values.

Mike Hansen - Lavalla Catholic College, Traralgon

Mike has been instrumental in integrating key Marist values within the pastoral care program and general curriculum at the College. He has guided students through their transition period and helped to lay the foundation for their growing Christian identity. Under Mike's direction, Year 7 students are now accustomed to gathering as a faith community several times a cycle. They are part of the ritual of preparing this time and space in their day. The Christ Candle is lit, the Gospel is read and then they pray together. For many, this experience is new. Despite this, all students are engaged and attentive. It is Mike who has been the chief designer of this successful program.

Mike is an important role model. He not only engages students but brings teachers together and encourages them to participate in religious education planning and programming. He is committed to student awareness of social justice and refers to these often as part of the Religious Education program at Year 7. A parent recently informed the school that her son "hated RE at primary school," however he now loved it. Staff noted that this change can be attributed to Mike's work.

Students are transfixed as Mike brings together the strands of everyday lives and the central values of the College's Marist identity. His questioning skills allow for students to uncover truths for themselves and he manages discussion seamlessly and logically. Mike's students often hear him say, "Be of good heart for the Lord is present."

LAVALLA TOUCH FOOTBALL STATE CHAMPIONS

It was a glorious sunny day that greeted our U15 touch football teams at the beach front fields of Elwood Park for the Victorian Secondary Schools Touch Championships on Friday, April 26.

Lavalla was represented by four teams with all teams reaching the finals but only two making it all the way to the Grand Final.

The U15 girls Championship team capped off a flawless competition to claim the State Title with an undefeated record while the U15 boys Championship team were outclassed by a superior Westall Warriors outfit in the final.

The U15 girls Plate team managed to get through their Pool matches with an unblemished record and then survived a drop-off to get past Haileybury B in the quarter final before being defeated by the eventual Plate winner, Mt Scopus Memorial College, 1-0 in the semi final.

The U15 boys Plate team also produced perfect record throughout their Pool matches and prevailed against Chaffey SC 2-0 in the quarter finals before being defeated by a slick Luther A team, 6-0 in the final.

Overall, a pleasing performance from many first time touch football competitors at this level.



LIVING WITH A YOUNG PERSON WHO SELF-HARMS? FREE FAMILY & FRIENDS FORUM

This forum is designed for family and friends of youth who may be at risk of self-harming behaviour. It is presented by Dr.Soumya Basu, who is a Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist working with the Latrobe Regional Hospital as a consultant Psychiatrist for the last 9 years. He has recently started his Private Practice one day a fortnight with the Central Clinic, Warragul aiming to cater to the mental health issues in the youth and adolescent population in the Gippsland area.

Dr.Basu who has trained both in India and Australia, has more than 16 years of experience in Psychiatry. After doing a Diploma in Psychological Medicine(DPM) and MD in Psychiatry from the prestigious Central Institute of Psychiatry, Ranchi, India he came to Australia and gained his Fellowship with the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists and has also trained to become a Faculty Member of the Child and Adolescent branch of the same college. Dr Basu is also a Senior Lecturer of the Department of Psychological Medicine at Monash University and has keen research interests in Youth Mental Health, Early Intervention, Developmental Trauma, Developmental Disabilities including Autism and Early Psychosis. Several of his research papers have been presented in National and International conferences. He is well acknowledged in Gippsland for his expertise in Youth and Adolescent Psychiatry and has been invited to various symposiums, seminars and lectures.

The general theme of the talk will cover:

- Overview about self harm in youth. Including various forms of self harm.
- Broad based understanding of self-harm behaviour
- Challanges and pressure on the family.
- · How to respond to self harm.
- · Self-care of family and friends.
- Share my expreience of working with self-harm in the region.

This forum is for teachers and other professionals who work with youth who may be at risk of self-harming behaviour, and is presented by Madeline Wishart who is a PhD candidate at Victoria University currently investigating the biopsychosocial aspects of self-harm.

Madeline has a special interest in working with adolescents who engage in self-harming behaviours. She codeveloped and facilitated the *From Harm To Calm* therapeutic group program and produced several resources. Madeline has presented numerous workshops nationally on managing self-harm in adolescents. She also has an interest in the ethics of conducting psychological research online and has a published a number of papers. Madeline has worked as a Youth Counsellor in Community Health, a School Counsellor; a Provisional Psychologist working with victims of trauma; and currently as a sessional lecturer and tutor at Victoria University.

The presentation will cover the following points:

- differentiating self-harm from suicide
- · what is self-harm: definition, methods, implements, triggers, risk factors, co-occurrence
- prevalence rates in Australia
- why do young people self-harm
- myths about self-harm
- how to recognise if a young person might be self-harming
- What to do & what NOT to do
- Managing & preventing contagion effects in the school
- crisis intervention & harm minimisation
