From the Principal

Dear Parents and Students

It is good to be back from my work in Brazil and I wish you a belated welcome back to Term 2. The work in preparing the *Marist International Assembly on Mission* is almost complete and will culminate with a ten (10) day conference in September. There is quite some excitement in the Marist world about this conference and insightful and exciting outcomes are anticipated. Over 100 international delegates, ten (10) of which will represent the Oceania Region, have been selected to contribute to the discussions and discernments about our future directions as Marist. I will be attending the Assembly as a member of the Preparatory Commission and will be away for the last weeks of Term 3.

College Master Plans

Earlier this week, the Leadership Team spent two days shaping and articulating our goals, expectation and aspirations for the College. As you are aware the College is investing energy into the Review and Renewal process; developing a Building Master Plan supported by a strategic plan and reviewing our curriculum offerings across the three campuses. We appreciated the opportunity to tease out and refine these future directions and in the spirit of this years' theme tried to approach and work with audacity and hope. I'd like to thank the staff who took responsibility for the campuses in our absences.
