Year 11 Exam and Workshop period:

Last classes for Year 11 will occur next Friday at lunchtime. Following the last classes will be a short closing liturgy followed by the traditional staff and student awards presentation. Students will then come back for their final Unit 2 Exams, which will take place from Monday, November 15 until Friday, November 19.

Some important information:

- 1. Students are only required at school for their exam. They may, of course, use the College facilities for preparation for the next exam.
- 2. All exams, except for exams requiring computers, will be held in the hall.
- 3. Students are asked to wear their full summer College uniform.

- 4. All candidates are asked to be ready for their exam at least fifteen (15) minutes prior to the exam.
- 5. All should be fully prepared with pens, pencils, rulers, highlighters, calculators, batteries, etc.
- 6. MOBILE PHONES are not permitted in the exam hall.

The Year 12 (2005) Workshops, which will take place from Monday, November 22 until Thursday, November 25, **are compulsory for all students returning to complete Year 12** and will give students important information about Unit 3 & 4 Course design and assessment requirements for 2005. Students need not wear school uniform for the Workshops.
