ENROLMENTS

The students have settled in well to the new year and we have been able to make a good start. Numbers are less than last year because we have reduced the class sizes to a maximum of 28 in Years 7 - 10 and a maximum of 27 in Years 11 & 12.

BUILDING PROJECTS

Presentation Campus

The contract for a Food Technology Room has been signed and the Builder has commenced construction. As well, high fencing around the property (1.3kms) is almost completed and we are planning for proper entrance gates and a brick entry feature to the Campus.

St Paul's Campus

We are about to sign a contract to commence a major refurbishment project. We will convert the Music Centre. This is the original building for St Paul's College, pictured on page 2. We will create two classrooms and locker area, a new Canteen and new shelter at St Paul's Campus.

Following this project, we hope to commence the refurbishment of the Stoddart Block (Grey St Classroom Block). This will mean that there will be some restriction on movements at the St Paul's Campus. The gardens surrounding this building have been removed in preparation for the project.

Canteen at St Paul's Campus

During the construction of the new facilities, the canteen at St Paul's Campus is being located at the Champagnat Centre. This change has been approved by the Council Health Inspectors and although there may be some limits to the organization and what is offered, canteen services will uninterrupted by the Building Project

THE BUILDING FUND

I am hoping that we will be able to use the College Building Fund to cover much of the cost of these projects. I need to minimise the loan as much as possible so as to maximise our capacity to do a good job with the Stoddart Block.

I recommend the Building Fund to you. It is a "**Tax Deductible**" Fund and is a very important source of finance for our buildings. The Catholic Community over the years since the commencement of the Catholic Secondary Education has done much to provide the facilities. It is now the turn of this generation of parents to shoulder the responsibility.

HOLIDAY PROJECTS

During the course of the Holiday period, we were able to spruce up the Music Classrooms at St Paul's Campus, as well as the area in and around the classrooms near the Champagnat Centre. We also completed some exterior painting on the first floor of the Kildare Campus and will gradually complete painting the Campus. We are also in the process of finishing a VCAL Training Room as personal fitness is a crucial part of the programme.

This association met about twice per term on a Monday Evening. However the attendance at these meetings has been very small and the Guest speakers we had engaged had ended up speaking to a very small audience of parents.

I am grateful to this small band of parents for the assistance they have offered and the advice they have given, sometimes alerting me to concerns of parents and making some suggestions. I have enjoyed the friendliness and support over the years and I have met some wonderfully generous people. But the low attendance means that there is now a serious question of the association's future.

We are not alone in this problem. Other schools and organizations will tell you how difficult it is to find people who have the time and energy to attend such meetings. Some Colleges have dissolved the association; others have re-organized activities along regional lines. I expect to be discussing the future of this Association with its leaders at its next meeting and with the College Council at the February meeting.

NEWSLETTER

INSURANCE

You would be aware of the current Insurance crisis and the issues with public liability. As I indicated when fees were increased, the increase in Insurance added some \$60,000 to our accounts.

As a part of our efforts to keep this down, we have arranged to fund a special cover for each student while he/she is at school or going to or from. This is called the CCI school care cover and an enrolment at Lavalla Catholic College means that each student is automatically insured. Information is available from each Campus Office.

AMBULANCE COVER

It is wise to consider Ambulance Cover. Our procedures require us to call an ambulance in certain situations such as back injury. Hence I cannot under estimate the importance of having this cover.

For those students who enrol in Outdoor Education classes, we will need to know about ambulance cover before excursions take place.

NEW FEES AND CHARGES PAMPHLET

Please note the inclusion of the 2003 Fees and Charges Pamphlet. Fees can be paid at each Campus. However EFTPOS facilities are available ONLY at Marcellin House and can ONLY be used <u>only for Tuition Fees and Charges</u>. All other payments must be made through the Campus.

CONVEYANCING ALLOWANCE NEW ARRANGEMENTS

New guidelines will apply from the commencement of this year.

All students seeking conveyance allowance support in 2003, both those currently receiving an allowance as well as new enrolments, will need to complete a new application form for lodgement with their school. You should have this form already.

We need to ensure that accurate distance and address information is available to the school to enable it to complete the school claim form. We have to the end of February to have the forms returned to the College. Make sure you check with your son or daughter if you have not received this form.

EDUCATIONAL MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE

The College now has to enter the details through the Internet and hence we need to have the forms completed and returned to the College as soon as possible. No late applications can be accepted. Educational Maintenance Allowance Forms are available at Marcellin House or Presentation Campus and can be completed and handed in there.

Please note the following:-

- ?? The Centrelink pension/concession card, allowance or benefit must be valid at 28th January 2003
- ?? The closing date for submission is 28th February
- ?? Late applications will **not** be accepted this year
- ?? The EMA provides \$254 for secondary students, two thirds (\$177) of which is paid in the first instalment. (one half to parents, through the school, one half directly to the school.)

UNIFORM SUPPLIERS

Our official uniform suppliers are Riggalls and I noticed another firm advertising uniform items that do not carry the College logo. The supply of uniforms is a very complex matter and we have been most satisfied with the arrangement and service of Riggalls. As a College, we cannot afford to lose the good-will and service of Riggalls.

The College's agreement to subsidize the change of the CRC blazer pocket to a Lavalla logo was completed last year. Those who failed to take advantage of this offer will now have to fund the change-over themselves.

VERY HOT DAYS

It is important that parents are aware that we make allowances for students when temperatures rise. Please remember that maximum temperatures are usually in the mid or late afternoon and that school can usually operate in the mornings unimpeded. The use of bottled water in the classroom has been allowed on these days, as are more frequent or longer breaks for some classes. The PE programme is

re-shaped or organized to take account of the weather. If the weather is forecast to be extreme or if there is fire-danger in the area, notification of alternative arrangements will be provided as soon as possible and on the 3TR and ABC morning programmes.

All students and staff are strongly recommended to wear head protection when outside the buildings during recess and lunch breaks. Navy blue caps or hats are the only acceptable cover for students.

St Paul's & Presentation Campus (Wednesday)

Homeroom commences at 8.50am. **Recess** is from 10.30 am to 10.55 **Lunch** is from 1.10pm to 2.00pm **Dismissal**is at 3.25pm

A 5 minute movement time has been allowed, so that there will be no excuse for lateness to classes

SECURITY

Security is an increasing concern and the following measures have been undertaken. The fencing at St. Paul's Campus and Kildare Campus has been most effective in securing these Campuses. Hence our first step at Presentation Campus Newborough is to secure the perimeter (1.3 Kms)

Another element of security is the proper wearing of the full College Uniform. This allows staff to quickly identify an intruder.

As well we have now installed cameras to operate at the Kildare Campus for computer rooms, the lockers and front gate as well as some selected sites around the Campus. We have had arson attacks on the bin containers and the burglary of four computers together with the associated break-in damage over the Holidays and we need to tighten up our security.

We have also cameras at Presentation Campus and they have been effective in improving the security. We will evaluate these measures and review security on a regular basis. Although we are careful about security, I don't want to spoil the very pleasant aspect that we have been able to create on each Campus.

SCHOOL PLANNER

I understand that there are still over 100 students who have not paid for the College planners. I simply remind all that the Planner is a compulsory purchase. It has some significant information and dates in it. Some students are careless in the use of the Planner and we are disappointed in this. However we still insist that all students have the Planner and will expect it to be produced on demand.

MENINGOCOCCAL C VACCINE PROGRAMME

This programme will be delivered by the local government immunisation providers at the time of other vaccine programmes. The vaccine only covers one type (C) of the disease and serogroup B Meningococcal disease is not prevented by this vaccine. Adolecents from 15- 19 will have access to the vaccine in the first half of the year. Students between 6 and 14 will be included in the programme from July 2003.
