A 5 minute movement time has been allowed, so that there will be no excuse for lateness to classes.

ATTENDANCE

One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that students attend school. Students need to maintain regular attendance to maximise their learning opportunities. Please remember that absent students miss out on learning opportunities and this can lead to poor performance. According to our records, students who are often absent perform less well. The College has an attendance system, which tracks the attendance of students and alerts us of regular absence or skipping classes. Attendance at classes is a requirement for VCE success. Any reference from the College refers to the pattern of attendance, because this is an important criteria for employers. As well the attendance of those students who receive the Youth Allowance is regularly checked by Centrelink throughout the year

We ask parents to ring or write to the College if the student is to be absent. Absence is accepted only where a sufficient reason, such as genuine illness, exists. Birthdays, shopping trips, and child-minding are not regarded as legitimate excuses. Sometimes the excuse of "not feeling well" looks dubious. Illness needs to be defined, not only to assure us, but also to alert teachers to be aware of this.

Students who are absent are expected to ascertain from teachers what work has been missed and to undertake that work.

COLLEGE PLANNER

I understand that the firm responsible for producing these failed to meet the required deadline, which has been most inconvenient for all concerned. We have commenced the difficult task of distributing these to those who have paid.

I simply remind all that the Planner is a compulsory purchase. It has some significant information and dates in it. Some students are careless in the use of the Planner and we are disappointed in this. However we still insist that all students have the Planner and will expect it to be produced on demand.

THE PRESENTATION CAMPUS CANTEEN

It has been necessary for us to hand over the management of this canteen to Heidi's Café, Moe and arrange to take over the canteen services. The Campus was really not big enough for us to cover the costs of staffing and operating this canteen.

The arrangement is that we will continue to seek volunteers for this Campus so that the viability of this canteen can be maintained and enable us to continue providing a service to the students.

THE KILDARE AND ST PAUL'S CANTEENS

The canteens on these Campuses are absolutely desperate for helpers. We are trying to maintain these Canteens through the use of volunteer parents. We don't want to start sending students down the street nor do we want to go down the track of outsourcing the service. We simply cannot go ahead with our present number of helpers. BUILDING AND MAINTENANCE PROJECTS

INSURANCE

Insurance premiums, as you would probably know, continue to rise in all aspects.

As a part of our efforts to keep this down, we have arranged to fund a special cover for each student while he/she is at school or going to or from. This is called the **CCI School Care Cover** and an enrolment at Lavalla Catholic College means that each student is automatically insured. Information is available from each Campus Office.

AMBULANCE COVER

It is wise to consider Ambulance Cover. Our procedures require us to call an ambulance in certain situations such as back injury. Hence I cannot underestimate the importance of having this cover.

For those students who enrol in Outdoor Education classes, we will need to know about ambulance cover before excursions take place.

THE STODDART BLOCK BUILDING PROJECT





This project is on schedule and we are more than happy with the approach of the Builders (Farnham Developments) to the building programme and the care they take with ensuring that students are kept away from the site. We would hope to occupy the first stage in April/May this year.

THE BUILDING FUND

I am hoping that we will be able to use the College Building Fund to assist in the financing of this major project. This will enable us to minimise the loans.

I recommend the Building Fund to you. It is a "**Tax Deductible**" Fund and is a very important source of finance for our buildings. The Catholic Community over the years since the commencement of the Catholic Secondary Education has done much to provide the facilities. It is now the turn of this generation of parents to shoulder the responsibility.

SUMMER

Although summer has been very mild so far, it is to be expected that there will be some hot and very hot days to come. Hence two things are worth noting:-

Very Hot Days

It is important that parents are aware that we make allowances for students when temperatures rise. Please remember that maximum temperatures are usually in the mid or late afternoon and that school can usually operate in the mornings unimpeded.

The use of bottled water in the classroom has been allowed on these days, as are more frequent or longer breaks for some classes.

The PE programme is re-shaped or organized to take account of the weather. If the weather is forecast to be extreme or if there is fire-danger in the area, notification of alternative arrangements will be provided as soon as possible and on the 3TR and ABC morning programmes.

All students and staff are strongly recommended to wear head protection when outside the buildings during recess and lunch breaks. Navy Blue caps or hats are the only acceptable cover for students.

Swimming Carnivals.

A special mention to be alert to these days and ensure that students at these carnivals have adequate protection. Staff members have been asked to follow up those students who are unprotected or not using shaded areas.

BUS TRAVELLERS

If students are new to the College or have changed address, they will be required to collect Conveyancing Forms from any of the campus offices to take home for parents to complete. It would be appreciated if these forms could be completed and returned by the end of this week to the Campus offices. We need to ensure that **accurate distance** and address information is available to the school to enable it to complete the school claim form.

Students who live more than 4.8km from their respective campus will be eligible for the Conveyance Allowance.

EDUCATIONAL MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE

The EMA is provided to assist eligible families with the costs associated with the education of their children. To be eligible for receipt of the EMA you must:

- ?? be either a parent or guardian of a primary or secondary school student up to the age of sixteen; and
- ?? be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 1986 or a Veterans Affairs (TPI) pensioner or be a foster parent.

The eligibility criteria must be met as at the first day of **Term 1, 28 January 2004** (which is the first day for teaching staff).

The EMA application **should be submitted to the school by 27 February 2004**or the first payment. The EMA provides an annual amount for secondary students of \$254 and is paid in two instalments. The College has to enter the details through the Internet and hence we need

to have the forms completed and returned to the College as soon as possible. No late applications can be accepted.

Parents with continuing eligibility, who are paid the first instalment of 2004 through this school, will **not** be required to complete a new application for the second instalment. Parents should notify Mrs Helen Orr at Marcellin House if they are not eligible to receive the second instalment of the Allowance. Parents who transfer children to another school after 27 February and prior to 6 August 2004 must re-apply at the new school for the second instalment.

Application forms are available only from Marcellin House or Presentation Campus Office.

YEAR 12 RETREATS AND YEAR 7 CAMPS

These retreats are conducted early in the year to ensure that the year gets off to a great start. The Year 12 Retreat and Year 7 Camps are most important activities and we do not encourage anyone to find an excuse to drop out. Those who do find some excuse generally regret their absence from these events. We are in contact with the Department of Sustainability and Environment in order to ensure that the sites are known to be safe. Co-ordinators will provide any further information required
