#### From the Principal's Desk

This week we gathered as a College to formally celebrate the beginning of the new school year and to commission Mrs Leanne Mills, our new Campus Director at Presentation our campus leaders and school captains. It is important that all of these people are acknowledged by the College community for the very significant roles they are undertaking. In the Marist tradition these are not positions of prestige, they are positions of service. Mrs Mills and the young people are undertaking to put the welfare of others first and to be of assistance and support to the College. We are most grateful to these leaders for their willingness to give of themselves for the good of the community and we wish them well.

Sadly our Commissioning Mass was marred by the absence of the local parish priests. In recent days they have had to contend with the deaths of both Fr Coffey (Drouin) and Fr Shanley (Lakes Entrance). Both priests have contributed in various parishes in the diocese for many years and I ask that you keep them in your prayers. Fr Shanley's funeral was on the day of our mass and we are most grateful to Fr Pat Keenan who celebrated mass for us.

**Br Julian Casey**, our former principal and now Provincial of the Marist Brothers Southern province, was a most welcome guest at the mass. We thank him for his continued interest in and support of this College.

We were very pleased with the demeanour of the Fourteen Hundred students through the duration of the mass. It is an impressive way for the new Yr 7 students to gain a sense of the size of the new community they have entered and the richness of a shared faith celebration. Our mass, as always, was augmented by the prayerful singing of our dedicated choir ably lead by *Mr Shane Reid.* We are also appreciative of the efforts of *Mr Mike Hansen* who prepared the mass and *Mr Gerard English* who guided us through the proceedings. Our College is richer for the contributions of all those who played a part in this mass.

Miss Anne Dooley from the Marist Education Commission held an in-service last week for teachers new to Marist schools. A number of our student leaders were invited to attend and explain how they saw the Marist pillars: Simplicity, Family Spirit, Presence, Love of work, In the Way of Mary, lived out in our College. Anne and the group were impressed with the poise and clarity with which these leaders spoke. They were to articulate Marist values and their application. Thank you Phoebe Trinidad, Sky Hammer and Jessica Edwards for representing your views and our College so well.

# St Paul's Campus

The Swimming Carnival is one of the few times our students take part in House activities. The four Houses speak about the four sources of the Lavalla spirit. Here is a brief look at people the Houses are named after.

**Champagnat House** (Blue) is named after Marcellin Champagnat, the founder of the Marist Brothers at La Valla, in France, in1815 Not noted for his academic performance, he was a hands-on, practical man. His experiences led to his vision to make Jesus known and loved. Education was the way he chose to help boys make better lives. The Marist symbol is the 'M'.

**Delaney House** (Green) is named after Bishop Delaney who founded the Brigidine Sisters in Ireland. At a time when religious education in Ireland was a crime, the Brigidines wove red crosses and placed them on the doors of the houses. The children would gather secretly in the hedgerows to be taught. The Brigidine symbols are the 'Brigidine Cross' and the oak tree.

**MacKillop House** (Red): Mary McKillop founded the Sisters of St. Joseph. She responded to poverty of the scattered rural communities in the 1880s. She began teaching in a shed in Penola, SA. Other young women gathered around her and went two by two to live among the people. Some died of malnourishment because they lived like the people. She was canonised by Pope John Paul II and is Australia's first saint.

**Nagle House** (Gold): Nano Nagle was a young socialite in Cork, Ireland. She encountered the poor and changed. She went into the streets and down the dank lanes in the mists with a lantern, gathering and ministering to the poor. Other young women joined her and they later became a teaching order, the Presentation Sisters. Her symbol is a lamp.

Year 7 Camps (11-22 February) Listening to the students talk about their experiences at Wilson's Prom is fascinating. Two nights in tents, three days of adventure activities, working together in teams, living together as a group, helped them with transition from Primary to



Secondary school. Students and teachers got to know each other better. We hope these relationships will strengthen in time and support each of them in their journey in this College. My gratitude goes to Staff who gave of their time, to parents who helped in various ways and to the students who entered enthusiastically into the life of the camp.
