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Vocational Education and Training (VET) Information

VET delivered to Secondary Students (VETDSS) is a Vocational Education pathway which can be undertaken as part of either the VCE (scored or non-scored) or VCAL certificates Pathways.

Our VET courses provide the opportunity of achieving a nationally recognised VET Technical and Further Education (TAFE) qualification within the Australian Qualifications Framework.

The Adult based training that students receive reflects specific industry competency standards for each qualification.

Lavalla Catholic College has arrangements in place with a variety of Registered Training Organisations (RTO's) to ensure we can offer a wide range of VET subjects to our students. VET courses may run over 1-2 years.

A key success of VET is the integration of Vocational (occupation focused) options within the traditionally academic studies at the senior secondary school level. Our VET programs allow students to:

- Develop job industry specific skills
- Gain nationally recognised Vocational Education and Training (VET) qualifications and units of competency while still completing their VCE or VCAL Certificates
- Develop employability skills and an understanding of the world of work, and;
- Gain valuable experience to assist with planning and pursuing their career pathways.

The VET Subjects listed on the following pages are indicative of the courses available for 2022 and are subject to change, depending on enrolment numbers and other factors influencing delivery of the course by the RTO.

Eligible Year 10 students may apply for an ON Campus VET Courses as an Enhancement subject only.

OFF Campus VET Courses are available to students in Year 11 & 12.

- **ON Campus VET Courses** are run at Lavalla Catholic College Kildare Campus either as a timetabled class, or 1 day per week.
- **OFF Campus VET Courses are not run at Lavalla Catholic College.**

Note: Parent/Guardians must arrange the student's transport to and from the relevant TAFE campus one day per week (usually Wednesdays or Fridays).

VET subjects run for the full year in both Semester 1 and Semester 2.

There is no mid-year intake for VET subjects

See the OFF Campus VET Course Information for details. Off Campus VET Students are also required to attend the VET Orientation Day in Term 4 if they have been accepted into the subject.

NOTE: Some courses may only offer partial completion.

VCE contribution in each course also differs.

Usually there are no additional school fees charged for students to enrol in a VET subject (excluding uniform requirements or course specific equipment set by the RTO). However additional costs may apply for courses that charge more than the funded amount.

The Parent/Guardian will be required to sign a VET Fee Agreement form in which the Parent/Guardian agrees to reimburse Lavalla Catholic College for any out of pocket cost should the student cease attending the VET subject or exit the College part of the way through the current year.

Student will have the first 3 VET classes to decide to withdraw from the course before the RTO charges enrolment fees.

Agriculture:


This qualification is delivered online with scheduled practical skills days and field trips throughout the year. It is ideal for those who wish to start a career in the food and fibre industry, or further develop their skills and knowledge at the assistant farm hand level. Through this course you will learn basic practical skills in fencing, monitoring water supplies, machinery operation, plant and livestock management. Students undertaking this course will gain the practical skills and knowledge required to carry out routine tasks under general supervision within the agricultural industry, and as this course is delivered via online/blended learning, it is ideal for students that are studying VCE or VCAL noting practical sessions will be scheduled during term breaks to minimise commitments during school time.

Conservation & Land Management:

If you have a passion for caring and preserving our environment, then this hands-on course is for you. Learn practical skills in native seed collection and propagation, bushland restoration, native plant and wildlife identification, pest plant control, fencing and maintaining structures, using maps and much more. Pathways may include employment into roles such as assistant land management officer, assistant conservation worker, assistant parks and wildlife officer. Some great skills to last a lifetime.

Horticulture:

If you enjoy taking a hands-on approach to learning, a Certificate II in Horticulture can take you where you want to go. This exciting qualification will take you outdoors where you will develop and practice skills in machinery operation, plant growth, soils, diseases and pests. You'll create and maintain garden beds, and learn vital nursery and orchard skills. Experience all that the horticultural industry has to offer in a fun and practical way.
