Catholic Identity & Mission


The Feast of the Assumption which was celebrated earlier this week, is celebrated throughout the world with processions, masses, picnics, town fairs and many other celebrations. In Australia we are somewhat more subdued in our religious celebrations, and often we can relegate such religious observance to being 'out of date' or no longer relevant to our lives. In our modern way of looking at the world, the Feast of the Assumption, the teaching of the Church that Mary was assumed into heaven, body and soul, at the end of her earthly life, can be difficult to understand. In fact, our understanding of who Mary really was can be limited by some cultural misunderstandings which have limited her 'connection' to our lives. Fr Richard Leonard writes that the New Testament accounts of Mary

As a Catholic school in the Marist tradition, we place before our staff and students an image of Mary as Jesus' first disciple: a woman of strength, courage and gentleness who is worthy of our attention. St Marcellin and his first brothers wanted to build a community dedicated to the work of Mary, in the way of Mary. We believe that this work requires of us an acceptance of others, in all their diversity, and requires us to embrace Mary's attitudes. Brother Michael Green writes that to do this is 'to discern God's will in [our] lives, and to do that through dialogue rather than passive and unquestioning submission.' (Christlife, 2019) May we learn how to slow down, to be more patient and to be strong like Mary in this way, listening for God's voice and the gentle encouragements of the spirit.

[do] not demonstrate a meek woman, devoid of creativity and initiative. [The New Testament] shows a strong, noble woman who put her free will at the disposal of God's will. That is what the feast of the Assumption celebrates: that because God will never be outdone in fidelity and generosity, he remained utterly faithful to Mary through death, as she was utterly faithful to him in life.

Celebrating Cultural Diversity



This week in our exploration of Lavalla's rich cultural heritage we travel a stone's throw across the Mediterranean, from Italy to the small island of Malta. The Latrobe Valley is home to one of the largest Maltese diasporas outside of Malta, with many students at Lavalla identifying with Maltese heritage. Malta has a unique and diverse food culture, with another two delicious recipies being shared with you in this issue. Please remember, no matter what cultural heritage you identify with, submissions are still open. Get your recipe in now!

To kick us off is year 10 student, Nicholas Cassar with

Stuffat Ta Majjal (Pork Stew)

Ingredients:

- 600g Pork belly
- 600g tomatoes
- 300g onions
- 200g peas
- 2 lemons freshly squeezed
- 5 garlic cloves
- 1 glass white wine oil
- Chilli pepper (optional)
- Oil
- Salt
- pepper

Method:

- 1. Cut the pork into medium chunks, put the lemon juice, salt and pepper in a bowl and mix well. Marinate the pork in this marinade for 30 minutes.
- 2. Peel the onions, garlic and tomatoes and chop them in medium size pieces.
- 3. Heat some oil in a large saucepan and fry the onions and garlic to a golden colour.
- 4. Lower the heat, add the pork, chilli pepper if using and salt and pepper, mix well and continue cooking.
- 5. Add the wine, peas and tomatoes and mix well. Check to see if the mix needs more salt and pepper. Continue cooking for a further hour, always on a very low flame.
- 6. Check frequently so that the stew doesn't dry up. Add some warm water in case this happens.

Next, we have some scrumptious Maltese biscuits courtesy of Year 11 student, **Isabella Herben**.

Qaghq (pronounced 'ah') is a traditional Maltese biscuit that has been enjoyed by generations and my family has baked them before. They are great to share with family and friends.

Qaghq (pronounced 'ah')

Makes 30 Biscuits.

Ingredients:

- 550g self-raising flour
- 200g butter
- 150g caster sugar
- 2 eggs
- Zest and juice of 1 orange and 1 clementine
- 1 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1 tablespoon caraway seeds (you can also use aniseeds or fennel seeds)
- Extra flour for assisting in making the round biscuit shapes
- 1 small bowl of sesame seeds
- 1 extra lightly beaten egg and a pastry brush

Method:

- 1. Sift the flour
- 2. Rub in the butter with the sifted flour mixture.
- 3. Add in the sugar, zest, ground cloves, caraway seeds, and eggs.
- 4. Slowly add in the juice until a soft dough is formed. You may not need all of the juice.
- 5. Chill in the fridge for about half an hour
- 6. Preheat oven to 200°C.
- 7. Using some flour if needed take a small golf ball sized piece of dough and form into a small thin sausage. Join the ends to form a circle.
- 8. Brush lightly with egg on the top of the biscuit and dip into the sesame seeds.
- 9. Place on a baking tray with baking paper.
- 10. Once the tray is filled place in the oven for 10 to 15 minutes until golden brown.
